Little Carne Nursery have had a very settled week. The preschoolers have enjoyed exploring the number 4 and the two year olds have been exploring weighing in the mud kitchen. We are beginning to investigate healthy eating and started this off by making a very tasty pasta salad.

This week, Towan class have been busy learning about dinosaurs! We have looked at and learnt about different kinds of dinosaurs and how they lived millions of years ago. We have also learnt about the palaeontologist Mary Anning and how we can still find fossils today - which we all thought was very exciting!! In mathematics we have been learning about measurement, learning about scales and capacity. In literacy we learnt about what a label is and how labels are used, we wrote our own to label a disnouar.

This week, Summers Class have been exploring old toys. They have borrowed a loan box from the Royal Cornwall Museum which contained toys dating back to the 19th Century. There were dolls, trucks, dominoes (made from bones) and toy soldiers. The children enjoyed looking and playing with the toys and thinking about how they are different from toys they have now. Also this week, they have been creating some great artwork based on a painting by Jasper Johns.

This week, Pendower Class have been learning about the religion of Islam. The children found out that their god is called Allah and he has 99 names. In science, the children received a letter from the three little pigs asking for help; they wanted to know what material would be best to build a house. The children tested materials to see which one was the strongest and waterproof. The children then wrote a letter to the three little pigs to tell them about their findings.


It's been a really fun week in Porthcurnick. We had a great ukulele lesson with Ed and learned to move from C to A minor to F and then we played a Bob Marley song. In art, the children used their new skills of mixing tints and shades with different painting techniques (such as dabbing with the end of the brush and using a cotton bud to create dots) to create some stunning 3D paintings of fruit.

Portholland Class have finished some wonderful self portraits using words for lines and mixed media for backgrounds. These will be shared on the class blog soon. They have also begun writing a narrative quest story as well as continuing their learning about Henry VIII and life in Tudor times.

This week, Porthluney Class have been discussing the concept of eternity, and whether love and life are eternal; we have had some very mature and thoughtful conversations and even been able to link our learning with our PSHE lessons when thinking about our dreams for the world.

During the school council meeting this week, members discussed suggestions from their classes and agreed further actions to take. These included playtime activities, links with Tregony Parish Council and the school library. Congratulations to all members who conducted themselves with respect.
