Dear Parents/Carers,

We have had a very busy week! We have had an external adviser and Mr Challis, CEO of our Trust, visit the school. On Friday, we had a visit from the English Hub who are supporting us with developing our phonics teaching and curriculum. These visits are always very useful and support the school in our improvements and in our aim to achieve our Trust mission hereby all our schools 'provides outstanding education for our communities, where everyone succeeds'. Our pupils were all confident to talk to our visitors about their learning and were excellent ambassadors of our school.

Little Carne Nursery had a great investigation with blackberries this week. They found some during a wellie walk and decided to collect them to take back to nursery. They used their senses to explore it, learnt how they grow and used tools to crush them up to make jam and natural paint. They also enjoyed creating artwork by staining fabric with the blackberry juice.

Towan Class has been very busy. At the beginning of the week, we went for an autumn walk down the muddy lane. The children did a sense walk and collected autumn items. On Thursday, the children used special art pencils and very carefully drew their autumn items that they found. In maths, the children have been comparing and ordering items according to their heights and length.

Summers Class have been learning about their senses this week, in particular the sense of touch. They used their hands to touch different objects and describe how they felt. They especially enjoyed feeling (and then eating) the marshmallow! Also this week, the children learnt in PSHE about how they



could be responsible people by helping at home, looking after each other and keeping the classroom tidy.

Pendower Class have been looking at creating texture in art. We looked at different mark making techniques to create texture when drawing a teddy bear. In music, we learnt a new song. We played musical instruments to the pulse and looked at the change of pitch. In science, we went into the woodland area to see what living things we could find in different microhabitats. We looked under the leaves and logs.

Porthcurnick Class have been writing up their Pompeii stories in their Star Writer books. While they were doing this, we had a visit from Mrs Douglass! She was so impressed with their focus and their stories that all the children were given a Headteacher's Award! In art, we enjoyed experimenting with rubbings of different textures - linen, baskets, wood, leaves and even scissors! We then ripped and cut our rubbings to create a picture in the style of Max Ernst with some very effective results.

Today, Portholland Class have started their art project, which is based on portraits. The children collected words to describe themselves from their peers and then used them to create a 'poem portrait'. In PE, the class collected results whilst completing their fitness circuit - which they will try to beat next week!

On Thursday, Porthluney Class went to the beach for the day. The children had a fantastic time hunting for life in the rockpools, playing games on the beach and exploring the shoreline. In addition to this, we walked along the coast path to sketch some views of the local area, which we are going to use in our forthcoming art project.


