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Dear Parents/Carers,

Little Carne Nursery has had a lovely week learning all about sea creatures. They enjoyed making jellyfish and reading *The Rainbow Fish*. The highlight has definitely been playing with the sea creatures in the sand tray with the blue sand! The children have had some new members of staff due to staff illness and we are proud of how well they have coped with this. Can we politely ask parents to ensure they arrive at 3pm to collect the children as our staff have to make a swift exit to meetings and Wrap Around after school. Thank you.

This week, Towan Class have been exploring; more, fewer and equal in our mathematics lessons. In English, the children have continued with their work on the book 'Farmer Duck', discussing and writing about where the lazy old farmer has gone and what he is doing. In our topic work, they have been focusing on jungle animals and exploring different facts including their environments. In PSHE, they have been discussing what they can do now that they couldn't do before.

This week, Summers Class have been continuing to learn about the properties of materials. They have been investigating how strong paper is and whether or not they could make a bridge to hold a toy car, using just paper and masking tape. The children worked well in their groups as this has been a focus in their PSHE lessons. They all had great solutions on how to make the bridge as strong as possible.

This week, Porthcurnick Class have been rewriting a section of our class read 'How To Train Your Dragon'. Pupils wrote these in the first person, as if they were the main character, Hiccup. In science, the children have been carrying out different investigations, finding out if all coins are magnetic, sorting magnetic materials and non magnetic materials as well as finding out the differences between magnets and magnetic materials.

Portholland Class have been busy writing persuasive letters to Mrs Douglass this week. Last week, Mrs Douglass told us that she intends to ban playtimes so that we can focus on our learning. However, quite understandably, the children think this is the wrong decision. The children's persuasive letters are fantastic, especially their use of rhetorical questions and flattery - they might just make Mrs Douglass change her mind.

This week, Porthluney Class visited Kresen Kernow - home to the world's largest collection of documents, books, maps and photographs related to Cornwall's history. They were taken behind the scenes into the archives to see where and how the historical sources were stored before investigating sources to explore the damage one air raid in Penryn caused for a local family.

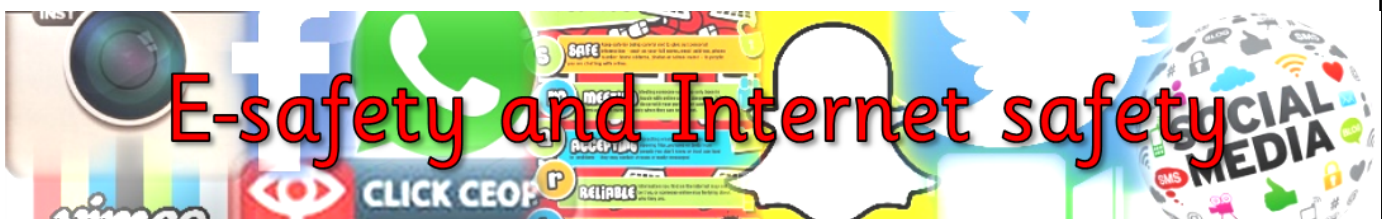
