On Wednesday, Year 6 parents and pupils were visited by staff from The Roseland Academy, to talk about pupils' transition from primary to secondary school. In Nursery this week, we have been looking at people who help us and also thinking about what job we might like to do . Our role play area has transformed during the week from a hospital to a police station to a post office and we have dressed up in costumes to represent the different jobs.

This week, Towan class have been investigating lots of different changes of states for example; Ice melting. They have looked at how we grow up and the different stages of development. The children especially enjoyed music this week, where they had their own scarf and had to dance/move to different types of music focusing on the pitch and tempo.

This week, Summers Class have been learning about harvest and the different ways that harvest is celebrated around the world. They enjoyed performing their retelling of 'The Enormous Turnip' to the rest of the school in our harvest celebration assembly. They have also had Mr Honour teaching them for the first time this week as he started his four weeks of teaching practice.

In Porthcurnick Class, we have been doing more body percussion, learning a routine based on boom (chest), clap, snap (fingers) and have started to invent our own. In French, we are learning how to ask and answer a question about what classroom item we have - Tu as une gomme? Oui, j'ai une gomme or Non, je n'ai pas de gomme.

This week, Portholland Class have been exploring the poem The Listeners by Walter de la Mare. The children enjoyed the spooky theme and enjoyed the challenging vocabulary in the poem. In science, the children have continued to investigate materials; they explored the ability of materials to insulate sound.

Porthluney Class have had a very musical week, learning how to sing a two-part song and accompany it with their own tuned instruments; this is on our class blog for you to view. The class have also completed creating their very own game on Scratch.

I hope you all have a wonderful half-term and that we have some much needed sunshine. We look forward to welcoming children back on Tuesday 2nd November, as the school is closed for staff training on Monday 1st November.


