Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

Last Friday, Key Stage 2 pupils were sent home a letter informing parents of which class they will be placed in next year. If you have not received this, please let me know. Our whole school transition day is now on the 5th July, although sadly, year six pupils will not have their planned transition day at The Roseland Academy. We will of course continue to review the situation and inform you of any changes to planned events if they arise. Whilst we have all been very focused on Covid lately, please be aware that there have been a number of pupils with chicken pox. Please be alert to any spots that may appear!

In Towan class, we have been exploring the book 'Little Red'. The children tasted Ginger Beer which enabled them to create some super adverts. The children were really excited to see that their caterpillars had all created their cocoons. We have also been investigating the weather and making predictions on what we think the weather may be like the next day.

This week in Summers' Class, we have completed our learning about 'Dougal's Deep Sea Diary' by writing a final diary entry for the book. The children debated whether or not Dougal should give up his boring day job and become a full time diver. Opinions were split however, most children felt that he should keep doing what he loved, diving! At the end of the week we completed a book review about the story.

In Porthcurnick class, we have been finding out about how dangerous plastic flotsam can be for sea creatures: we have written some very moving narratives in the role of sea turtles. We have also researched the inhabitants of rock pools and made some stunning information posters. In science, we have been learning about how shadows are made and creating shadow puppets with our hands.

The last two weeks saw some children in Portholland class take to the waves during our surf days. We had an amazing time in some challenging conditions and learnt a lot about being resilient, particularly when the weather was not on our side. We have finally finished the book we have been reading in English, 'Odd and the Frost Giant' and have begun our retelling of the story for our final big write of the year.

Pupils in Porthluney Class have been very busy once again, surfing on Monday and taking part in their final sailing session today. They have shown great resilience, skill and bravery. In PE, Porthluney Class have been practising using rounders bats, before playing a full game next week.

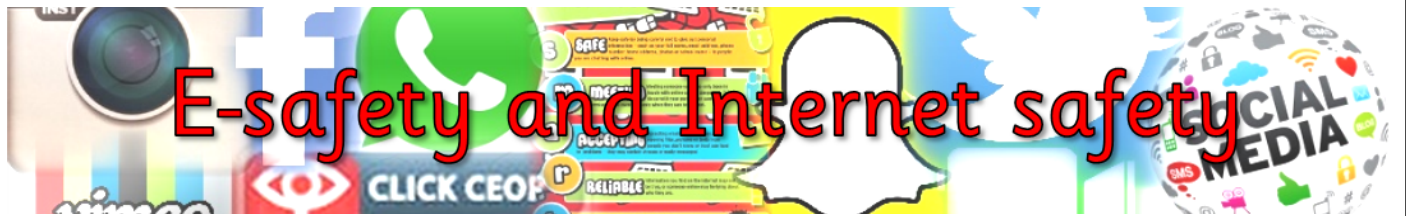
