We have had a great response to our Key Stage 2 surf days, but there are still some places available so please email Debbie if your child would like to book a place. Don't forget that from Monday - Thursday of next week, Portholland Class has swimming lessons.

This week, Towan class has been focusing on halving shapes and addition in maths. They have loved their PE lessons, having enjoyed practising and improving their football skills. In their topic work, the children have thoroughly enjoyed designing and making their own pets.

Summers Class have been working hard to create sequences of movements and shapes in their PE lessons. They have learnt about different shapes and different rolls and have worked together in groups to decide a sequence to practise. They have worked really well in their groups, some all together, some with one person in charge, and are looking forward to showing Miss Mulroy their work next week.

In Porthcurnick, this week, we made our own viewfinders. We then chose a part of our fruit sketches to scale up for our design for our clay tiles. In English, we have been exploring the characters in 'The RIver Singers', writing first impressions of the Great River and writing dialogue. We have also had comments from other classes about how impressed they are with our recorder playing!

Portholland Class has been learning about Viking gods in preparation for writing a non-chronological report. They have also been using Scratch in computing, learning how to change backgrounds and sprites, before analysing simple maths games and creating their own..

Porthluney Class is learning about classifying living things in Science. This week, the children put this into practise by creating their own classification keys to sort a variety of sweets, which they then named based on their features. Luckily, there were no extinctions during the lesson!
