It was a pleasure to accompany Porthcurnick Class on their local river walk on Tuesday. Their knowledge of the geographical features of rivers was amazing and they were full of surprise when they realised just how big the river once was. Their local history knowledge was impressive too as they were eager to show me clues that evidenced how the river had silted up.

In Towan class this week we have been investigating life cycles of different types of animals. The class have thoroughly enjoyed creating homes, picking and naming their own caterpillars. In our topic work, we have been looking at our village, Tregony, and have been exploring/discussing which places are important to us.

In Summers Class this week we have managed to finish sewing all of our felt fish! The children have worked extremely hard with this task and all have been able to sew independently. The finished products look fantastic. We have also started a new text in English, Dougal the Deep-Sea Diver, and the children have been thinking of adjectives to describe what Dougal can see when he is diving.

In Porthcurnick, we have been writing a recount of our wonderful river walk. We have also been researching the major rivers of the world - it has been interesting to see the size of them compared to the River Fal!

In Portholland class, during science we have been investigating circuits and exploring what makes a successful one by overcoming problems that occur.

Porthluney Class have been writing pok-a-tok match commentaries in English; we've challenged ourselves by writing in the present tense! We have also learned about the Maya gods, and why there were so many.
