This week, Towan Class have been looking at the human life cycle and how they have changed from starting in Reception in September. The children have also enjoyed exploring different materials to find out if they are waterproof and discussing what being waterproof means.

In science this week, Summers Class have planted some sunflower seeds. They learnt about how to plant a seed and what seeds need to help them grow. They are looking forward to seeing them grow over the next few weeks. Also this week, the children created 3D pictures using card in the colours red, white and blue, in celebration of the Coronation.

This week, Pendower Class have been practising their ball skills in PE. They have been throwing, catching and dribbling. In writing, the children started learning the story 'Grandad's Island'. They have been learning to retell the story using different storytelling actions.

In Porthcurnick this week, we retold the story of the Mermaid of Zennor from the perspective of the mermaid. In French, we have learned numbers to 12 and now know how to say how old we are. In art, we drew some sketches in preparation for making soap sculptures inspired by Barbara Hepworth.

This week, Portholland Class have started reading 'Egyptian Cinderella', a narrative based on the well known classic. After discussing the similarities and differences, they have started to create a storyboard of the narrative. They have also been learning a song about Ancient Egypt in two parts and are starting to add music using glockenspiels.

In history this week, the children in Porthluney Class have learnt about the swinging sixties, a period of huge societal change. The children were keen to learn about how life changed dramatically during this decade, especially for the young. On Thursday, Porthluney Class participated thoughtfully in a workshop led by 'Show Racism the Red Card.' This anti-racism, educational charity visits schools and organisations all over the country to educate people about racism. In the workshop, the children learnt about the importance of challenging stereotypes.
