At the meeting, we will talk through what phonics actually is, how sounds are correctly pronounced and how we teach phonics at Tregony School, using the Read Write Inc scheme. The meeting will take place in the school hall at 5.30pm.

Little Carne Nursery has had a busy week, enjoying learning all about themselves. They have been drawing pictures of their favourite toys, talking about their families and exploring their favourite colours. We have enjoyed seeing all your lovely photos on tapestry this week. Thank you.

Summers Class have been working hard in phonics this week, getting back into the swing of our Read Write Inc lessons. In history, they have started learning about what childhood was like when their grandparents were children. In music, they have started to learn about the pulse and rhythm within music.

Pendower Class have been working very hard this week. In history, they have started to learn about why we celebrate Bonfire Night. In art, we have been experimenting with different materials. In science, we have been sorting objects into whether they are living, no longer living or never been alive.

The highlight of the week for Porthcurnick Class was our trip to Porthcurnick beach on Tuesday. We spent time rockpooling (and found lots of crabs and jellyfish) then created some sand art in groups and finally walked to Porthbean beach to have a picnic. It was a great day to get to know each other better and the children behaved very well indeed. Comments by members of the public made us very proud!

Portholland Class have started their science topic all about materials and their properties. They have planned an investigation where they have to help Cinderella clean up after her messy family members. The problem is, she can't use her hands! We'll let you know next week how the challenge goes. The children have also enjoyed being active outside, practising their football skills.

Porthluney Class have been exploring Cornwall's ancient history and asking lots of questions that will hopefully be answered throughout the term. They have also continued work on their art unit, based on 'retrofuturism', by recreating part of an image with a variety of materials and techniques.

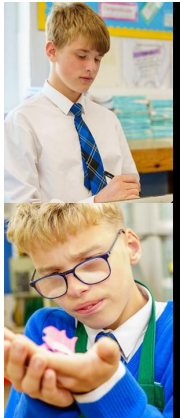
