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Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

We have started the first of our swimming sessions this week. Staff at the leisure centre commented very positively on pupils' behaviour and the progress made with their swimming over the course of a week. Next week, Towan class will be swimming on 14th and 16th March and Summers Class will be Swimming on 15th March, 17th March, 7th April.

Next Friday, we will be holding a non-uniform day in aid of Comic Relief and to raise money towards Unicef's children's charity for children affected by conflict in Ukraine. We will open Parent Pay on Tuesday for donations - thank you.

This week we have been very busy learning all about Farm animals. Children have also been trying really hard to be independent by putting their own coats, waterproofs and shoes on. They are getting really good at it! Please encourage this independence at home. To help, we recommend shoes with velcro instead of laces. Little Carne have really enjoyed their outdoor play this week and have been very busy building ramps and bridges for vehicles, which has been great fun to watch. We have a missing puddle suit here at Nursery, a green cameo pattern. If you have come across it, please let us know.

This week, Towan Class have been very busy. In English, they have written about and drawn what happens next in the story of 'Arrgghh a spider'. They were very excited today to finally find out the ending of the story. The children have also enjoyed learning about minibeasts and their habitats. They have been exploring and investigating them within our school environment. In art, they have been exploring the artist Piet Mondrian and have created their own version of his art.

This week, Summers Class have started to learn about the signs that tell us that spring is on the way! They talked about these and drew and labelled spring pictures. They have also started learning about real life superheroes and, in particular, Grace Darling. The children learnt about Grace Darling and have been finding out as much information as possible in preparation for them to create a fact file about her.

Porthcurnick Class started to learn about the Bronze Age and how the discovery of metal had a major impact on people living then. They continued with their textiles project, practising running stitch and cross stitch, this time on felt. They were delighted with the results. In tennis lessons, they learned about the ready position and played some floor tennis.

Portholland Class started their new Design and Technology project this week. The children started by exploring different bridge designs and then created their own out of card. After this, the children enjoyed making truss bridges out of spaghetti, bridges they are in the process of finishing before they make wooden bridges later this term.

Porthluney Class have had a very busy week, swimming in the afternoons. They have made excellent progress and are looking forward to their fun session. Some year 6s also had their first SATs revision session after school where they focussed on using a protractor to measure and draw angles; they all had brilliant attitudes and felt more confident as a result.
