In maths, the children have been counting and learning different strategies for larger numbers of objects. In art, we have been working on our drawing skills by looking for geometric shapes in what we are drawing and, in music, we learned what a minim is and played a harmonic ostinato on the glocks.

Last week, we explored and then recreated a painting by David Hockney. 
This week, KS2 pupils have been practising sprinting and baton handovers in preparation for Sports Day next half term.
