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Dear Parent(s)/Carers(s),

We have had such a busy week with various visitors from our Trust. They were very impressed with pupils' curriculum knowledge and the teaching that they observed.

Parking and Drop Off:

We understand that parking at the start and end of the day is a real issue which has been compounded by work on the new-build. However, please can we request that you do not park on the round-about and/or block the entrance in and out of the school. This makes it impossible for cars to move freely in and out. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter. There is additional parking at the Social Club.

Little Carne Nursery have continued their learning about winter and ice and have been enjoying observing the frost outside. They have also been practising their key skills of this half term including pencil grip, playdough skills and completing puzzles. They have really impressed us with their concentration and focus.

This week in Towan Class we have been busy exploring light. We discussed what activities we engage in during the day and what we do at night, we also learnt about nocturnal animals and made clay owls. We also had lots of fun exploring a dark tent with glow sticks and glow stones!

In Summers Class this week, the children have been learning about primary and secondary colours. They created colour wheels by mixing the primary colours and making secondary colours. Also this week, they have been learning about toys that their parents and grandparents would have played with. They were interested to learn that some toys that their grandparents would have played with are still around now.

This week, Pendower Class wrote a spine poem about a dragon using exciting adjectives and verbs. The poems were fantastic! In PSHE, the children worked in small groups to achieve a goal set by Jigsaw Jo. Some children learnt to count in French, some made a card and some learnt a dance. In history the children have been learning about significant people beyond their living memory.

In our art lesson this week, the children used their skills of mixing paint with black and white to create shades and tints of the same colour. The results were some 3D paintings of mugs and spheres. In history, we learned about the incredible Neolithic village in Scotland, Skara Brae and what this tells us about prehistoric houses.

This week, Porthluney Class have been continuing their English work based on Pandora, the moon from the film Avatar; they have recapped previous learning on expanded noun phrases and prepositions as well as learnt about hyphens. They have also learnt about the start of World War Two, reenacted it with playdough and had a debate, arguing what they think was the most significant cause.
