Dear Parents/Carers,

In Little Carne Nursery, the children have been getting ready for Christmas. They have enjoyed decorating our tree, making cards and baking Mince Pies. They have also been learning about the Christmas story and have enjoyed retelling it with our Nativity figures. Well done Children, you've all had a great week!

In Towan Class, the children have been exploring different timetables and comparing themselves to a familiar character, 'Henry Finch'. The children have created their own timetable for him. In maths, they have been exploring one more and one less of a given number up to 6. They have thoroughly enjoyed practising the Christmas play using the 'big' stage.

Today, linked to their 'Food Glorious Food' topic, Summers Class have been on a visit to a cafe in Truro. They were able to visit Sambells Cafe in Truro Methodist Church, where they looked around the cafe and kitchen and studied the menus to decide what they would like to eat, but also to think about where the food on the menu had come from - its food journey. After a snack and drink, the children were then able to explore the church and finally they gathered around the Christmas tree to sing one of the songs from our Christmas play to a small audience.

In Porthcurnick, we finished writing our orangutan reports and also performed our rainforest music using body percussion and glockenspiel loops to represent the forest floor, understorey, canopy and emergent layers. In French, we worked out what different French sentences about the classroom meant and then wrote our own sentences in French.

Portholland Class, have been busy this week completing their assessments. Alongside these, the children have been busy working on their Christmas lanterns and their nursery rhyme pop-up books, which they hope to share with children in Towan and Summers before Christmas.

Porthluney Class have been very busy this week, creating Christmas lanterns and completing their assessments. The year 6s have completed their very first SATs tests and have amazed me with their positive attitudes and results! We have also been creating Ancient Egyptian artefacts including amulets, canopic jars and papyrus paper, as well as playing Ancient Egyptian games.
