On Thursday, the school enjoyed celebrating World Book Day by wearing their pyjamas and spending the day carrying out activities focused on reading. Everyone snuggled comfortably and shared their favourite books.

Little Carne Nursery have enjoyed a week of learning about The Hungry Caterpillar. They also had a great time for World Book Day and Pancake Day. The highlight this week has been tasting pancakes, making natural crowns in the woodland and enjoying bedtime stories with their teddies. Can we politely ask parents that toys and belongings from home are not encouraged in Nursery and we ask for children to wear or bring in indoor shoes as well as wellies.

Towan Class have been learning about safari animals and their habitats. We have been looking at the book 'Handa's surprise' and drawing/writing about things that they would like to have in their basket. On Monday, Towan especially amazed me with their super musical and listening skills. Also, this week, the children loved meeting our vet visitor and thoroughly enjoyed asking questions about their job.

Summers Class had a great last cricket lesson with Mr Shaikh this week. They put together all of the skills that they had learnt during the previous weeks in order to play a game of 'Rapid Fire'. The children had to work as individuals in order to score runs and as part of a team in order to field the balls and stop the other team from getting runs. The children worked well together and



had a great time. Also, this week, the children have been working in small groups to compose a piece of superhero music, incorporating the aspects of music that they have been learning about: tempo and pitch.

Porthcurnick Class have been writing instructions on how to tame and train a dragon. They have started their new textiles unit, practising running stitch before they start working on their dragon eye mat designs. They also had a very interesting lesson thinking about all the different friends they have in their lives, where they met them, why they are their friends and who their most important friends are.

Portholland Class have been enjoying using 'Tuesday' by David Wiesner in their English lessons this week. In the book, giant lily pads appear all over the town one morning but the residents don't know where they have come from. The children have been writing newspaper articles based on this story, which were very amusing indeed!

Porthluney Class have been learning about the D-Day landings and describing scenes using their senses as part of their English lessons. In science, the class has been making periscopes and explaining how they work. The year 6s have also been tackling algebra with great attitudes towards their learning.
