We are noticing that some of our older pupils are arriving before the school gate opens at 8.40am and are unsupervised. I have had two parental concerns regarding unsafe behaviours during this time. Pupils have been playing games on the round-about, climbing the hedges and playing unsafe games with sticks. We will monitor this closely next week but for health and safety reasons please can you ensure that pupils do not arrive long before the gate opens unless supervised. Thank you.

Little Carne Nursery have enjoyed discovering new life this week with our tadpoles and caterpillars. They explored beans and the life cycle of a beanstalk which led to some lovely child initiated play about Jack and the beanstalk. The children are looking forward to their list farm trip of the term on Monday.

This week in Towan Class, the children have been learning all about what a good friend looks like and what you need to do in order to be a good friend. The children have also thoroughly enjoyed learning all about how dinosaurs lived, linking it to other animals. On Thursday, the children learnt actions to go with a specific fairytale song. They impressed me with how they worked together to perform their songs and create their own actions.

This week, in science, Summers Class have been learning about how the seasons affect different animals and have learnt about hibernation and migration. In PSHE, they have been thinking about all the ways that they can keep clean and healthy. In geography they learnt about what life in the Amazon Rainforest is like.

In science, Pendower class received a letter from Humpty Dumpty asking them to find a material he could wear to protect him from a fall. The children tested four materials by wrapping an egg in the material, dropping the egg from a metre high and then checking to see if the egg had cracked. They found out that bubble wrap and cotton wool were the most effective at protecting an egg. The children then wrote a letter back to Humpty Dumpty explaining their results.

In Porthcurnick Class, we have continued reading 'Journey to Jo'berg' and also started 'Long Walk to Freedom' by Nelson Mandela. The children were fascinated by his incredible life story and some said their parents remembered Mandela's warm relationship with the Queen. In music, we improvised in pairs, using Call and Response with the Dixieland style song 'Oh When the Saints.'

In Portholland Class this week, they have begun writing their 'defeating the monster stories' based on the legend of Beowulf. In science they have created scale versions of the solar system and were surprised by how far away the gas planets actually are. In computing, they have also been creating Islamic repeating pattern art using scratch.

Over the past few weeks, the children in Porthluney Class have been exploring classic poetry in their daily reading lessons. The poems explored have challenged their understanding of vocabulary, inference and the use of poetic devices. A particular favourite has been 'The Way Through the Woods' by Rudyard Kipling.

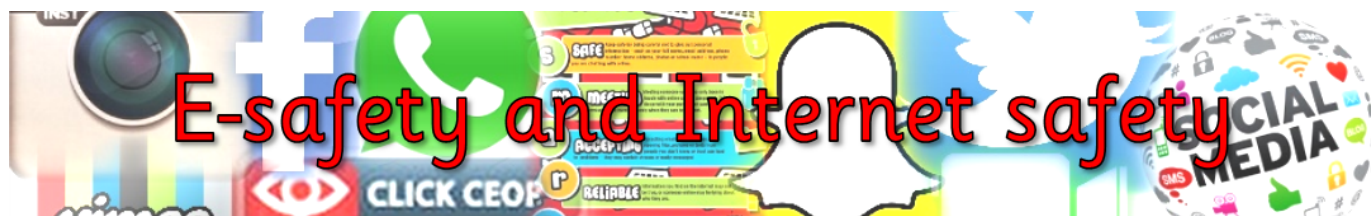
