Dear Parents/Carers,

I can hardly believe that we are fast approaching the end of November and Christmas is creeping up on us! I hope you all received my Christmas dinner letter yesterday, which will be held on Wednesday 16th December. Children are also invited to wear their Christmas jumpers in return for a voluntary donation towards the charity 'Save the Children'. Whilst on the note of Christmas, this year we are unable to invite you to attend our nativity, Christmas fete and end of term assembly. Instead, you will be sent a video link of our Key Stage 1 nativity, class Christmas themed performances and a presentation of Class Shields and Learning to Learn Awards. This will all be recorded and sent to you via a video link/disk. These videos will also be placed on our website and our social media platforms. I am aware that a few children are not permitted to be recorded and we will, of course, involve these pupils fully but not within the video itself. However if there are any changes to this, and you are happy for them to be recorded, please inform us. Thank you.

This week, Towan class has been looking at instructions and what they are used for. They have created their own bird feeders by following some simple instruction. During child initiated play, I have loved watching how some children have worked together to build a tractor using lots of different resources.

This week, Summers Class has been creating fact files about landmarks in London. They have also been starting to learn about the Great Fire of London and how the fire has made London a better place. With Mrs Paully in music, they enjoyed watching and learning about different types of instruments found in an orchestra. They particularly enjoyed conducting the orchestra!

This week, Porthcurnick Class have finished their woolly mammoth reports in English and created a huge class cave painting in art. In science, they have been investigating soil and learning about what it contains.

Portholland Class have had a busy week with their work on legends coming towards an end. They have begun writing their own, and lots of them are already looking particularly gruesome. The class have also enjoyed their work in science this week, where they have been exploring the adaptations that animals make to their environment.

Porthluney Class have been investigating water resistance in science. In geography, they have also been designing Tregony in the future as well as creating Ancient Greek sandals in design technology.

Next week, on Tuesday 24th November, pupils whose parents have signed up for the flu vaccine will be receiving this. The vaccination is free and recommended for young children; it is administered by a quick and simple spray up the nose. 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you must opt in to the programme. If a consent form is not submitted, your child will not be vaccinated. For your information, the children's other health screening services will be paused for the time being but hope to resume next year.

We are still very concerned that some pupils and parents are walking through the middle of the car park at the end of the day. Please can you support us in ensuring everybody's health and safety by using the pavements when you exit. Thank you.

Finally, I would like to share the good news that Miss Worledge has passed her National Award for Special Educational Needs Coordination, achieving an overall grade A!
