Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a very busy week at Tregony School this week. Towan class visited the Roseland farm and Summers class visited Summers beach in St Mowes. We welcomed our Key Stage 1 parents to a phonics meeting, which was very well supported. Thank you. We know that children who practise reading often through phonics are able to develop into fluent readers, who can quickly recognise familiar words and easily sound out new words they encounter. The sooner children learn to read, the more they foster a love of reading and this is a very important part of achieving our Trust mission. If you attended the session, please can we ask that you complete the feedback questionnaire that has been emailed out to you. Our year 6 prefects have taken on their new roles and have really impressed us with the way they have taken on their roles. Staff have been commenting positively on this and the way they have demonstrated such responsibility. Thank you. Thank you to those of you who donated clothes for our Bag2School fundraiser. Nasal Flu Vaccine

In 2022/23, all children in Primary Schools from Reception to year 6 (inclusive) will be offered the vaccine. The vaccination is free and recommended for young children; it is administered by a quick and simple spray up the nose. Please enter www.nhs.uk/child-flu to access information explaining the vaccination programme which also includes details about the small number of children for whom the nasal vaccine is not appropriate. The code for your child's school is: EE142668. Please submit your consent form by midday **MONDAY 10TH OCTOBER 2022** to ensure your child receives their vaccination. If you experience any problems accessing the form please telephone 01872 221105 and the team will be happy to help. **Please note that as in previous years you must opt into the programme. If a consent form is not submitted your child will not be vaccinated. We cannot accept consent over the phone.**

In Nursery, The children have been learning all about Autumn. They have enjoyed some lovely mark making and observational drawings of Autumn treasures. We enjoyed making an apple crumble together and painting our own houses.

In Towan Class this week, we have been sorting and matching different objects and describing similarities and differences. On Thursday, the children thoroughly enjoyed visiting The Roseland Farm where they groomed goats and explored different minibeasts. The children discussed the different types of countries they were from and what the weather might be like there. In art, the children explored chalk and how to make different marks with them. The whole class enjoyed making their playground very colourful.

This week, Summers Class had a great trip to their beach, Summers Beach in St Mawes. They collected shells and pebbles to make pebble pictures, used their senses to record what they could see, hear, touch, smell and taste and had some free time exploring and playing with their friends.

This week, Pendower Class have been working really hard in writing where they wrote a character description using lots of expanded noun phrases. In art, we have been using different materials such as crayons, charcoal and oil pastels to experiment with mark making to create texture. We had a go at cross hatching, scribbling and stippling to create different effects.

In Porthcurnick Class this week, we have been writing powerful descriptions of the eruption of Vesuvius. We also learned about why Boudicca led a revolt against the Romans and how 10,000 Romans managed to defeat a Celtic army of 100,000! In French, we made puppets to perform a French rhyme with a backdrop of Paris scenes and, in PE, we developed our throwing skills, throwing more accurately with both hands.

This week, Portholland Class have been learning about King Alfred the Great, and discussing whether he was in fact very great at all! They have completed excellent portraits of him, as well as interrogating sources to find out about the Vikings. In science, they have been drawing circuits using scientific symbols and discussing the importance of this.



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It has been another busy week for Porthluney Class. In history and English, we have been learning about the ancient Greek gods. We enjoyed making Top Trumps cards in English and, in history, we learnt about the different powers that the Greek gods had. In art, we have started a new unit inspired by photography. We created photomontages from photographs in newspapers and magazines; the children's work was very creative.

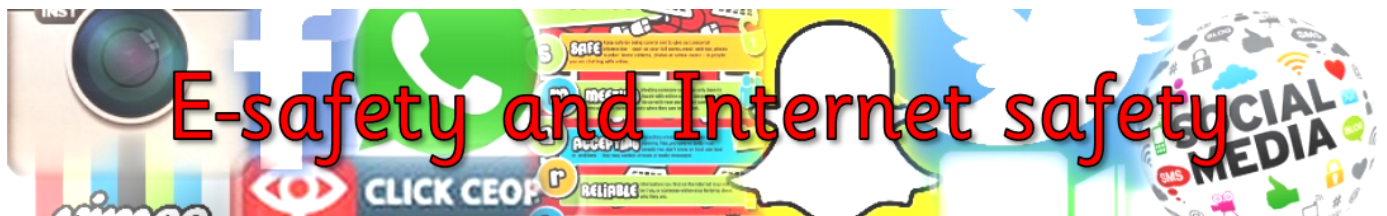
