Pupils in Year 6 were busy learning about bike road safety around the village with biking teacher Emma Roberts. On Wednesday evening, I was fortunate to attend the Truro and Roseland Learning Community Cathedral Awards. This Is an evening of celebration where children from schools in Truro and the surrounding area receive commendations for a number of reasons ranging from sport, creativity, academic, global responsibility and endeavour under difficult circumstances. Congratulations to our winners: Riley F, Caitlin, Mia, William, Aubrey, Lola and Lawrie.

On Sunday, Key Stage 2 pupils have been invited to perform songs from our Summer show at Caerhays fete. Pupils should be ready at the front gate (opposite the car park) at 10.45 am, ready to perform at 11.00am. An accompanying adult will receive free entry along with their child. It would be



great to see lots of pupils there as the school will receive a sizable charitable donation towards our fundraising.

Everyone should have received an email this week regarding class structures for next year. Pupils in years 4 and 5 will receive a letter informing them of which class they will be placed in next year, early next week. We are delighted to have appointed Bethany Uren as our new year 2 teacher in September. Bethany has been a teacher for two years, teaching year 2 pupils at a school in Camborne. She will be attending our transition day on Tuesday the 21st June when we all look forward to meeting her.

Little Carne Nursery has enjoyed a lovely week of activities. They enjoyed learning about capacity by filling different size containers with water, and messy play materials. They were great at using mathematical language such as 'full' and 'empty'. Little Carne has also been learning about keeping our oceans clean for World Oceans Day. We came up with some ideas on how to stop rubbish going into the sea. Check our class page to see what they did. A big well done to our Preschoolers for a successful transition session into Reception today; they were very independent and well behaved for Mrs Gunningham.

Towan Class has explored what bibles look like and some stories within it. They have especially enjoyed exploring what water is and what sounds it makes and looks like. Sports Day is soon and the children have loved practising running in lanes and using running equipment.

Summers Class has been busy this week, learning about food chains, practising for Sports Day and finding out about climates around the world and which animals live in the different climates. The Year 1s have also been working extra hard completing their Phonics Checks. They all did a great job.

Porthcurnick class has been researching beavers in preparation for their visit to Woodland Valley Farm on Monday - also the home of the Cornwall Beaver Trust. The children also considered the principles of organic farming and, in contrast to this, watched the animation 'The Scarecrow' which shows an alternative world of food production run by robot crows!

Portholland Class has made a strong start to the final half term. In RE this term, the children have been learning about how religious belief encourages people to make the world a better place. Learning about the Golden Rule, the children considered how they may bring more forgiveness, kindness and generosity to their own lives.
