Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to the Spring Term and happy new year! I hope that you and your families had a lovely, restful Christmas break and your children are refreshed and ready to return to school.

Earlier this week, I sent out an email regarding Covid and some new guidance regarding testing and isolation periods. I have also attached a useful flow chart which explains the changes to isolation times.

Despite it being the first week back, we have had a very busy week! Pupils have returned to school ready and eager to learn. On Monday, I enjoyed accompanying Towan Class to The Roseland Academy's farm. Pupils were delighted to see the animals and even had the opportunity to hold and stroke some of them. Pupils were very excited and they all behaved beautifully. On Friday, a member of The English Hub spent the day at school to support us in reviewing how we teach reading and to observe our school's reading culture. This was a very positive visit. Our visitor commented on our pupils' excellent behaviour for learning and positive attitudes.

This week, Towan Class have enjoyed their topic launch, 'Going to the Farm'. In English, they have been writing and drawing about the animals they saw during their farm visit. In maths, they have been looking at different ways to make 5, using numbers. The whole class was delighted to meet our pet guinea pigs. They all decided to name them 'Teddy' and 'Billy'. We are looking forward to learning about how to care for them.

Summers Class have loved the start of their new 'Superheroes' topic. They have a bit of a mystery to solve, however. On Tuesday a superhero called Flash Lightning Boy came to visit them, but by the afternoon he had vanished and a strange card was left in his place. The next day another card had been left, with a message. Someone had taken Flash Lightning Boy! The message said that clues will be left for the class next week to try and solve who has taken him. As well as this mystery, they



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have started to read 'Send for a Superhero' in their English lessons and thought about moving like a superhero to the Superman theme tune.

Porthcurnick class was surprised this week by CCTV footage of a dragon visit to the classroom. We are currently writing a news report about this strange occurrence. We also started investigating the features of castles in DT and in French, as language detectives, we found we could work out many French words by using cognates (close matches).

Portholland Class have made an excellent start to the new term. The children continue to be enthusiastic about their learning. In our English lessons, we have been exploring Aaron Becker's book *Journey* which has really sparked their imagination. Next week, we will be using the sequel, *Quest*, to write our own stories.

This week, Porthluney Class have been exploring their new topic: The Battle of Britain. They have shown great interest and have been asking some excellent questions whilst reenacting the outbreak of World War Two with playdough, sorting historical sources, visiting the War Memorial, learning about life in the 1940s and drawing Spitfires.
