Today, the whole school, together with Gerrans school, visited the Hall for Cornwall for a magical performance of Peter Pan. This was a truly lovely trip and treat for our pupils who have worked so hard this term. When we got back, pupils were greeted by an elf who joined our pupils on their Santa Run, raising money for Cornwall Children's Hospice. In the evening, we held our first Christmas fete for many years, thank you to our wonderful group of parents and Ashley who helped organise this event. Money raised, contributes towards treats for our pupils such as the pantomime and Christmas parties.

In Towan class we have had a wonderful week celebrating Christmas! We performed our Nativity 'Twinkly Nativity' where all the children sang and performed with such big smiles and confidence. We all enjoyed a fantastic Christmas lunch wearing our Christmas jumpers! We have been busy in class making Christmas crafts including wooden tree decorations and peppermint creams! We have been writing Christmas words using our phonics knowledge, practising our letter formation and have also been learning about squares and rectangles!

Summers Class have had a very Christmassy week! They have starred in their nativity play, enjoyed Christmas lunch, creating Christmas cards and crafts and had a fantastic time watching the pantomime at the Hall for Cornwall today. On Thursday they took part in a super singing workshop from the Cornwall Youth Choir.

Pendower Class took part in a singing workshop with Leanne from the Cornwall Youth Choir. First the children warmed up their voices before singing some Christmas songs and taking part in singing games. The children have also been locating countries near the equator and countries near the North Pole. They then decided if they would prefer to live in a hot or a cold place.

In Porthcurnick Class, we worked in groups, 2 children doing body percussion and 2 playing the glockenspiels to create the four layers of the rainforest. We also started celebrating Christmas by making positive/negative space tree cards and we learned about Benjamin Zephaniah and read his poem Talking Turkeys which the children really enjoyed.

Portholland Class have been feeling festive. We have been using maths skills to solve Christmas riddles and puzzles. Last Friday we had a brilliant day in Truro carrying out some geography fieldwork as well as visiting the Cathedral and Library.
