Dear Parents/Carers,

This week has been such a busy week! I was teaching in Towan Class at the start of the week and it was lovely to be back where I started my career. I can't explain how wonderful it was to be back in the classroom, where I started in the EYFS. The children were amazing and seemed to adjust very well to the change of teachers. Over the next few weeks, all of our pupils will be making willow lanterns for the Tregony Light Parade. This will take place on Sunday 5th December, all children are invited to join the procession with their family and we will meet in the school hall at 5.30pm, ready to process at 5.45pm. Children must be supervised.

Another great week for Little Carne Nursery. We have joined in with two celebrations; World Nursery Rhyme Week and Children in Need! The children had a great time learning lots of different nursery rhymes and completing specially themed activities. They have really shown off their beautiful singing voices to us all!

Towan class has had a super week, continuing with their class read 'What makes Me a Me'. Pupils have been looking at the different characters in the book and using and applying their phonics knowledge to write labels.

This week, Summers Class have been continuing to learn about the seasons and they went on an autumn walk. They were able to spot different signs of autumn, including falling leaves, mushrooms and blackberries. Also, we have been learning about how food actually gets to our plates. Children created food stories about different types of food, showing the different stages from arowth/production through to how it gets to the shops/our plates.

This week, Porthcurnick Class has been acting out the story of 'The Vanishing Rainforest'. We have also learned about deforestation and the reasons why it is happening. In music, we created loops



on the glockenspiels to represent the sounds of the canopy and emergent layers of the rainforest and, in art, we put together our rainforest collages for our final piece in our John Dyer topic.

Portholland Class have been enjoying learning about the life and accomplishments of Amelia Earhart. They have been inspired by her achievements, including being the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean. This week, the children have been writing newspaper articles about her mysterious disappearance over the Pacific Ocean in 1937.

Porthluney Class have furthered their understanding of Ancient Egypt this week by visiting the Royal Cornwall Museum. They handled and identified artefacts, saw a real-life, a 2500 year old mummy and reenacted the mummification process. Their behaviour was excellent and they all thoroughly enjoyed their trip.


The School Council have been thinking about Christmas and are asking if anyone would kindly donate a real Christmas tree that they can decorate for the entrance into school. Thank you.

Your child can have access to a School Nurse at any time if you have any health concerns, in addition your School Nurse offers a full health assessment in reception and year 6.

The School Nurse can check:

- Your child is growing healthily and support with healthy eating
- Support with access to dental care and general support for dental hygiene
- Help with day / night time wetting or soiling
- Provide information about immunisations
- Guidance re healthy lifestyles
- Support with general hygiene issues including head lice and worms
- Support with general emotional health issues
- Support to access other health professionals
- Routines, including sleep

Additionally in Year 6:

- Friendships
- Relationships
- Development, including periods and puberty
- Access to specialist services including dietician, healthy weight programmes and voluntary services
- Developmental issues
- Transition to secondary school
- Healthy lifestyles
