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Dear Parents/Carers,

I had a wonderful time accompanying Portholland Class to the Museum of Global Communications at Porthcurno. Pupils were wonderful ambassadors of our school, not only in behaviour but their focus and engagement also.

There has been a gradual rise in Covid cases across the school this week; please follow the guidance to help limit the spread. Since Wednesday 22nd December, the 10-day self-isolation period for people who record a positive PCR test result for COVID-19 has been reduced to 6 days in most circumstances; unless you cannot test for any reason. Individuals may now take LFD tests on day 5 and day 6 of their self-isolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of self-isolation. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart. This also applies to children under five, with LFD testing, at parental or guardian discretion. If both these test results are negative, and the person does not have a high temperature, they may end their self-isolation after the second negative test result and return to school from day 7.

People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, should take a LFD test every day for seven days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time.

Please can we politely request that children not play with the outside toys before or after school, including the Nursery outdoor equipment. The outside areas are set up by staff ready for the day's learning or tidied away at the end of the day. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Little Carne Nursery had a wonderful time celebrating The Year of the Tiger. They enjoyed their Chinese feast, practised Chinese writing, and explored lots of messy play. The highlights have been outside water play with our new equipment, a visit to the play park and bug hunting in the woodland.

Towan Class have enjoyed learning about Chinese New Year. The children have created their own dragons, tried Chinese food, danced like a dragon and learned about 'The Great Race'. In English, the children have been retelling the whole story of Farmer Duck using our story map.

Summers Class have been learning about how certain materials are used for specific jobs and the different properties that these materials have. They have also enjoyed another session of cricket with Mr Shaikh where they were being 'super strikers', learning different cricket strokes and how to hit the ball.

Porthcurnick Class learned how to make nets to create 3D shapes for their castles; also, how to create facades, drawing brick and stone effects, to finish the look of their castles. I have really enjoyed watching their collaboration and problem solving during this project.

Portholland Class enjoyed a brilliant visit to the Museum of Global Communications on Thursday. The children had a fantastic day learning all about the importance of Cornwall as a world centre for global communication. In particular, the children really enjoyed visiting the WWII bunkers and seeing a giant Lego model.

Porthluney Class have been focusing on writing excellent character descriptions, based on Lenny, the main character from 'The Lion and the Unicorn'. They have also been experimenting with light,



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proving that it travels in straight lines, and creating designs for their final art piece based on silhouettes and paper cutting.
