In Little Carne Nursery we have been learning about Remembrance Day by making poppies for our wreath, we learnt a song and went to the church to lay our wreath. The children observed a minute of silence and watched the Cbeebies poppy animation.

In Towan Class we have been learning about different festivals (Hanukkah) and exploring the music they listen to. The children have learnt all about Remembrance Day and why we celebrate it. Also this week, the children thoroughly enjoyed exploring and learning all about magnets.

This week, Summers Class have started learning about "What is it like where we live?" in geography. They thought about places that they visit often and rarely. They drew maps of their journeys to school. They have also been learning about mammals in science, and the specific characteristics of mammals. At the end of the week we spent some time learning about Remembrance Day and why people wear poppies at this time of the year.

Pendower Class have been looking at different types of weather in geography. This week, we wrote about the weather we have seen and then pupils presented the weather forecast to the class. In English, we have been writing setting descriptions, using our senses to help us. The children's vocabulary choices have been fantastic!

Porthcurnick Class have written impressive letters from Lila, the main character in the book, The Firework Maker's Daughter, to her father. In PE, we have been learning how to improve our running and relay techniques and in DT, we have started our cooking unit by learning about seasonal food.



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Portholland Class have been writing in roles through diaries. We have been exploring characters in drama activities related to our class book, Cinnamon. In art, we finished our multi-media portraits. . In PE we have been learning a dance from another culture as well as how to pivot in netball.

Porthluney Class have been writing their own poems inspired by Night Mail by WH Auden this week. The poems had rhythm, beat and rhyming couplets. On Thursday, we visited Boscawen Park to look at playground design. We are now going to be making our own model playgrounds in our DT lessons.

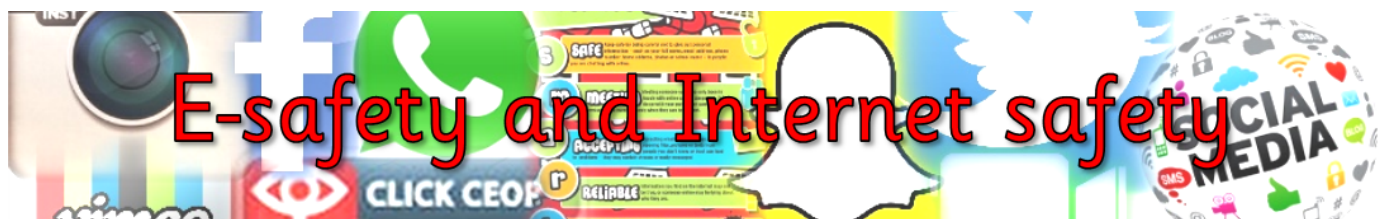
