## Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to the new school year; we hope that you all had a lovely summer holiday with your families and that your children are refreshed and ready for the Autumn Term. It has been lovely hearing about pupils' summer holidays this week.

All staff have been very impressed by the positive way your children have returned to school; it is as if they have never been away! There is always a bubble of excitement when starting a new class, year group or being reunited with friends. We have welcomed a staggering 27 reception children this year; we think this must be a record for the school! It has been lovely meeting new (ond old) families this week and I am hoping that, very soon, we can welcome you into school for special assemblies, celebrations and performances once more. Please can you ensure that you have signed up to the SchoolGateway app. This is important as we use this for school communications as well as for making payments for school dinners, trips and clubs. Please can we politely remind you that we have pupils who have a severe peanut allergy. Due to this, we would be most appreciative if you could consider what you are packing in your child's lunchbox and we request that foods containing peanuts are avoided. We understand that there may be traces of nuts in many food products and it is difficult to be completely nut free, but we would be grateful if you could support us with this.

All parents/carers will have received an email with a class letter, homework and spellings today. Please, also, take some time to look on our website; your child's/children's class page will tell you what they will be learning this term. Each class has a knowledge organiser for each subject, which includes lots of information about our curriculum so that you can discuss and support learning at home.

Sadly, Covid is still with us. Please can we request that should you or your child show symptoms pof Covid, that you follow public health advice on <u>when to self-isolate and what to do</u>. Pupils should not come into school if they have <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u>, have had a positive test result or other reasons requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing on COVID-19 (for example, they are required to quarantine). Children under the age of 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case. Instead, children will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test. We would encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so. Pupils with a positive LFD test result should self-isolate in line with the <u>stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19)</u> <u>infection</u>. They will also need to <u>get a free PCR test to check if they have COVID-19</u>. Whilst awaiting the PCR result, the individual should continue to self-isolate. If the PCR test is taken within 2 days of the positive lateral flow test, and is negative, it overrides the self-test LFD test and the pupil can return to school, as long as the individual doesn't have COVID-19 symptoms. In Nursery, this week, all children have enjoyed a fantastic start to the new term. Despite the large disparity in weather this week, the children have fully enjoyed the outdoor learning environment. We said our final goodbyes to Kirsty, who will be dearly missed and we wish her well for the future. Our school nursery has available places for 2, 3 and 4 year olds. The children in Towan Class have settled in really well. We have been learning all the names of the areas within the classroom. We thoroughly enjoy our wake and shakes in the morning. In phonics, this week, the children have been learning and naming objects and recognising initial sounds within simple words.

Summers Class have enjoyed the start of their Food, Glorious Food topic. On Tuesday morning, they devoured different types of breakfast from around the world and then each child planted some carrot seeds. They have also painted pictures and written about their favourite foods. In history, they have learnt about the types of food that their parents and grandparents might have eaten when they were children.

This week, Porthcurnick class had a great start to their Amazon topic, creating tribal face masks including different designs to scare away outsiders and animals. In English, they have been writing narratives about tribes from the Amazon, hunting for animals, using time conjunctions. In computing they have been experimenting with Scratch, learning how to animate sprites to make them move and talk.

Portholland Class have made a great start to the new academic year. In geography, the children have enjoyed investigating where their clothes come from and locating these countries on a map. In science, we have completed our first investigation; we investigated the best materials for a kitchen work surface. The class has returned to school with a great deal of enthusiasm for learning, a readiness to work hard and to follow our school rules. We are all excited about the year ahead!

Porthluney Class have had an excellent first week of the Autumn Term, mummifying tomatoes in history, making blood smoothies in science and playing hockey and netball in PE. They have all returned to school with positive attitudes towards all aspects of school life and have taken on their roles as prefects with great maturity. We are all looking forward to the exciting year ahead!
