Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a very busy week, blessed with lots of sunshine! Today, the school supported the 'Jeans for Genes' charity by wearing denim and making a donation to the charity. Thank you for supporting this worthwhile cause; we are yet to count how much we have raised, but will let you know next week.

In Towan class, this week, we have been observing our growing cress and have been exploring different wild flowers. Pupils have been reading and wondering where `Farmer Duck` has gone on his holiday. It has been lovely to hear the children's thoughts and ideas. In maths, the reception children have been exploring numbers.

In Summers Class, this week, we have started to learn about the artist LS Lowry. Pupils learnt that Lowry only used five colours in all of his paintings and they used these to see what different colours they could make when mixing them together. The results were all very different. Please have a look at the pictures on our class blog.

This week, Porthcurnick Class have been writing their final newspaper reports about a neanderthal sighting. They have all been working hard on their presentation, which is already progressing very well. They have focussed lots on times tables, which need a lot more practise yet! In science, they have been observing rocks, making careful sketches and using adjectives to describe their features.

Portholland class showed impressive empathy when learning about and discussing refugees in PSHE. They have also learnt about how we all have rights, responsibilities and rules. In science, they have been learning about living things and looking at the different habitats around the school.

Porthluney Class have been investigating air resistance by making their own parachutes. The children found that the larger parachutes took longer to reach the ground because the forces were more balanced. In art, they have been creating their fruit pots, inspired by their fruit paintings. Please look on our blog to see pictures of these.

On the 28th September, pupils will be having individual school photos. This year, all pupils will have them taken and it will be your choice as to whether you purchase them. There will be a paperless system whereby a link is sent to parents via a secure portal for them to view and order. Unfortunately, due to covid restrictions, we will only be taking individual photos and no groups or siblings.




We have had a great start to sports clubs this week. Children were praised for their enthusiasm and behaviour by the outside providers. Well done Tregony!


