Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

Next Friday, we look forward to celebrating the Coronation of King Charles on Friday by holding a whole school tea party. We are inviting staff and pupils to wear red, white and/or blue to help celebrate the day.

We have noticed an increase in the number of our children wearing smartwatches in school. We know that mobile phones/smartwatches can be a valuable and important resource for our children; we frequently discuss the safe use of these devices, both in general and as part of our online safety lessons. Despite the obvious distraction that these devices can pose, smartwatches are internet and camera enabled and therefore present the same concerns as mobile phones in terms of safeguarding and GDPR. Therefore, we ask that pupils do not wear smartwatches to school or they hand them in to the class teacher at the start of the day and collect them at the end of the day. We thank you for your understanding and support with this matter.

Little Carne has had an exciting week. Our butterflies came out of their cocoons and we released them outside and watched them fly away. We have enjoyed learning some new dance moves in PE and made sandwiches fit for the King using our lettuce that we have been growing. Our children have also been enjoying our new light table and creating some fantastic models and patterns on it.

This week, Towan Class have been discussing the importance of exercise. In Religious Education, they especially enjoyed learning about mosques and how Muslims demonstrate their faith, resulting in them all wanting to make their own prayer mats. On Thursday, the class had a revision session on how to use scissors and explored how to cut in different ways. They loved making a mess with all the paper on the floor!

In Summers Class this week, the children have been learning about the different parts of plants and thinking about the question 'Do all plants have flowers?' In music this week, the children have been learning about pitch. They created their own 'jingle' for a superhero, using one high and one low note on the glockenspiels. The children have also had fun this week, creating art sculptures from rolls of coloured paper.

This week, Pendower Class started their history unit of learning about Cornish heroes. We looked at six different heroes through time and placed them on a timeline. We can't wait to find out more about them. In English, we have been writing instructions on how to make a disgusting sandwich. Some of the instructions were extremely revolting!

Porthcurnick Class started learning about 'Cornwall as a seafaring nation' with a visit to the National Maritime Museum on Thursday. The children took part in a workshop on the history of Packet Ships in Falmouth as well as making their own rope. After having a go at controlling miniature sailing ships in the boat pool, they spent time exploring the rest of the museum, including the new pirates exhibition.

This week, Portholland Class have been writing instructions, explaining how to complete the process of mummification. They have also been investigating Ancient Egyptian patterns and using them to begin to design an Ancient Egyptian scroll, which they will be making in the following weeks. They have also been composing their own pieces of music based on hieroglyphs!

This week, Porthluney Class have begun to explore paintings from the Newlyn School of Art. The children were interested to examine these paintings – from the turn of the century – and to discover what life would have been like in Newlyn during this period. Also, the children were interested to see how life in Newlyn has changed in the past one hundred years.
