We will also be holding a raffle at our nativity play performances. You can also purchase tickets via the Gateway from today. We will be selling refreshments at our Christmas events and at school before the lantern parade next Sunday.

Little Carne Nursery have enjoyed preparing for Christmas this week, with our enrichment morning with Towan, writing letters to Santa and practising Christmas songs. We are excited to be having new flooring fitted over the weekend too, to make further improvements to our setting. Our preschool children are very excited to be attending the pantomime on Monday. Please remember Nursery is closed to all children aged 2, or those who have turned 3 this academic year.



Towan Class have been very busy this week. They have been practising Christmas songs for the nativity show. On Wednesday, they went to visit the Roseland Farm. Together, as a team, they scooped up bark using different resources and created a pathway for the wheelbarrows to go when collecting hay for the animals during the winter. On Thursday, they joined up with Little Carne to introduce our first day of Christmas activities.

This week, Summers Class have been learning about maps and plans and finding out about the points on a compass in geography. They learnt how to read a plan of the classroom and add things to it in the correct places. Also this week, the children have been learning about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores, and which animals fit into the different groups.

Pendower Class have been writing stories based on The Lion Inside. The children worked really hard on including expanded noun phrases to describe the characters and the setting. In geography the children have been learning about what countries make up the United Kingdom and named their capital cities. They learnt a song to help remember them.

Porthcurnick Class has been cooking again. Last week's seasonal soup was a hard act to follow but this week's apple crumble was absolutely delicious and there was rather a long queue for seconds! In geography, we learned about the effects of the Tohoku earthquake in Japan in 2011, the strongest recorded earthquake in Japan's history, which caused a 39m tsunami with devastating consequences.

Portholland class have worked hard to complete their myths and are now exploring poems written in rhyming couplets. They have been using "The Night Before Christmas" and "The Polar Express" as inspiration for their writing. In Geography they have been learning about rivers of the world and how they are used and changed by humans.

Porthluney class have been enjoying their science lessons this term; the children have been learning about forces. In this week's lesson, the children learnt about different machines (levers, pulleys and gears) and they made their own mechanisms. In readiness for Tregony's Lantern Parade on Sunday, the children have made willow lanterns in the shape of Christmas presents.
