Towan Class have worked hard practising their songs for the Easter assembly. The children have been learning all about the life cycle of a flower, resulting in them weeding and planting bulbs in our outdoor environment. The children have also been writing lovely sentences about our caterpillars.

Summers Class were very excited this week to go on a trip to the Royal Cornwall Museum. In class, they have been learning about local heroes, and one in particular: Richard Trevithick. At the museum, they met 'Mrs Trevithick', who told them stories about Richard and his inventions. They also made a clay tile of his greatest invention, the Pen-y-Darren. The children were an asset to the school, behaving and listening well and working hard to create their clay tiles. Once back in school, they wrote great recounts of their trip. Well done Summers Class.

This week, Porthcurnick Class have started their dragon eye mats, using running stitch to create pupils and also a glint in the eye! They have also learned how society developed in the Iron Age, with the important discovery of iron and the building of hill forts. In outdoor learning, we have been creating dens, using just natural items found in the woodland area.
