Recommended age 13+

'Played on PlayStation 4, Xbox One, Windows, and Mac. Mobile version available. The game has a cartoonish style, and the violence, while persistent, isn't bloody or particularly gory. Its online nature could expose younger players to offensive language from random strangers in voice or onscreen text chat.'
