This half-term has flown by and I am sure that everyone is grateful to finally see some sun and feel some warmth. The glorious weather is set to continue for half-term too. Next half-term is going to be even busier with lots of trips, visits, school camps, sports day and much more! I hope you all have a lovely half-term and enjoy the glorious weather.

Towan Class has had a super week. They have enjoyed using their fine motor skills in order to make snakes. I was impressed with how well all children were able to follow complicated instructions. This half term, the children have also been exploring different things that grow and they thoroughly enjoyed having a visit from kittens (which were only three weeks old).

This week, Summers Class have been busy making windmills for a mouse to live in. They learnt about how windmills are constructed, with a structure, axle and a turbine. They drew a design on the structure that they thought the mouse would like and then cut the net and made a cone and a cylinder to complete the structure. The next stage will be making the turbine. Also this week, they have composed a superhero piece of music which included different tempos, dynamics and pitch.

This week, Pendower Class visited Kresen Kernow as part of their history unit. The children visited the library and the strong room where they keep all of the archives. The children then used some of the archives to learn about three Cornish heroes. They learnt about John Couch Adams, Rowena Cade and Henry Trengrouse.

As part of their learning about Cornwall as a seafaring nation, Porthcurnick had a visit from Hannah Clark from Camel Fish to find out more about fishing in Cornwall. She talked to the children about her three boats and how they catch mainly crab and lobster, which is then transported in specially equipped lorries around the UK and Europe.

Portholland Class have been learning about Howard Carter and his discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb, as well as the Ancient Egyptian gods and goddesses. In art, they have completed their scrolls on their own papyrus paper - see our blog for pictures.

Porthluney Class had a superb trip to Penlee Gallery and Museum on Tuesday. The children learnt more about the Newlyn School of Art and were able to see examples hanging in the gallery. The children enjoyed exploring the artefacts on display in the museum and completed their own sketches of a Newlyn fishwife from the 1890s. Our Y6 children have had an excellent second sailing session at Percuil River.
