Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

On Monday, we had a very successful transition day despite there being a few Covid secure adjustments. Pupils in Portholland Class were excited to meet their new teacher, Mr Richards. Our new reception children were incredible and came into school calmly and confident. This afternoon, end of year school reports have been emailed home. There is also a feedback form and a link to make an appointment, if you wish to discuss the report with your child's class teacher.

Please can I request that our new reception intake return their enrolment forms to the school office. Also, Year 6 were sent some forms that need to be completed for The Roseland Academy. Please can these be returned to the school office too. Thank you.

Whilst all restrictions are due to be lifted on the 19th July, the school has taken the decision to continue with our current Covid risk assessment. As cases have risen, we have made the difficult decision not to open some events up to our families, including Sports Day. We will still hold our Sports Day during the school day and will share the results with you on our social media pages and the newsletter.

Preschool/Nursery leavers enjoyed their Transition Day in reception class this week. Our younger children enjoyed a more quiet day all to themselves! Our topic for the week has been worms and gardens. We read Superworm and learned it nearly off by heart. We made our own wormery and watched the worms get to work on the soil through the glass. We have done measuring and comparing sizes of worms and our word of the week this week was thick, so we looked for things which were thick.

In Towan Class, we have had a postcard from Mr Wolf saying he is on holiday at Disneyland. The children were very excited to make their own postcards of them going on holiday with Mr Wolf. In science, we have been looking at the weather and made water gauges to see how much it rains within a week; the children have been really excited to look at them each day.

Summers Class all enjoyed their Transition Day on Monday. During the week, we have been creating story maps about an underwater story called 'Something Fishy'. We have enjoyed describing the hat turtles, sock fish and trouser shark that are characters in the story. This week, in art, we have been creating spiral and circular sculptures from natural resources.

In Porthcurnick Class, we had a very interesting discussion about stereotypes and whether some jobs should be done by males and some by females; we also talked about what we are looking forward to next year. In science, we have been learning about shadows and have started making our own shadow puppet theatres.

In Portholland Class this week we have been busy thinking about and discussing moving into our new classes. We spoke about worries and concerns and things we are excited about and looking forward to in PSHE. We also worked on self portraits with Mrs Hancock using mirrors and water colours.



This week, Porthluney Class have been learning about the Maya and their disappearance; we have come up with their own theories based on evidence. We have also challenged Portholland to a rounders match next week, and started practising!
