Action Employment of a sports specialist teacher	£13,230	To lead P.E and sport, aid with planning for teachers and advice for improving lessons. To help to upskill other members of staff by offering guidance and help with their subject knowledge. By doing this, class teachers will have more confidence in their own ability and deliver high quality P.E lessons on a weekly basis. Pupils will experience and benefit from quality P.E teaching and we will see an increased progression in skills. Organise and run both our intra school sports day and The Roseland Cluster Inter School Sports Day. To run after school clubs alongside outside coaches to offer a wider range of sports and in doing so get more pupils involved in extracurricular sports clubs.	We ensure planning provides opportunities for pupils to self and peer assess during lessons, and also challenge themselves to their own abilities. We have teaching points that highlight the key skills for each unit and break it down so that pupils can see what they need to focus on. They are also able to lead warm ups within lessons and take on an active role by coaching and refereeing which provides more challenge to talented sportsmen. Pupils are actively engaged in all lessons and teachers can see progression throughout each half term in the sport that they are focussing on. P.E WALTs for each end of unit link to the National Curriculum standards and help show progression through each key stage.This year we have offered different clubs to appeal to more pupils. Scheme of work	£900	Purchased a new scheme of work to ensure full coverage, progression and confidence in teaching.	At the end of this year we have reviewed our curriculum and decided that we can further improve this by purchasing a scheme of work. Our Sports Lead researched schemes of work, looking at which best suited our school and discussed this with all other teachers. Rising Stars 'Champions' was chosen due to it coming in a hard copy as well as being online and having videos. It is similar to our computing curriculum which staff find well- resourced and easy to follow.			
Equipment	£800	To ensure that we have a wide range of sports kit that will aid in us offering a variety of sports during lessons and in clubs.	An inventory was taken to find out what equipment needed to be replaced and if there was anything missing. We ensure that staff always have what is needed for lessons and our outside club providers also make use of our equipment.			
Transport to swimming and sporting events	£900	To take the cost of transport to swimming off of parents. Paying mileage to staff members to aid transport to swimming and sporting events.	All KS2 took part in swimming this Summer term and this year we changed it so that they swim for four afternoons in a week. This worked well as we saw pupils progressing much quicker and have had over 50% of KS2 pupils achieve national swimming distance.
