Little Carne Nursery has been very busy this week, learning about the Hungry Caterpillar. We have also been preparing for our parent stay and sing session next Thursday at 2:50pm. The children are enjoying practising their spring songs.

This week, Towan Class have been busy planning their bookmarks ready for next week when they will sew them. The children have enjoyed making a story and matching it with musical instruments. Next week, the children will be retelling the story by using a range of percussion instruments. Towan Class have also been focusing on what makes a good friend and have been practising this within the classroom.

This week, Summers Class have been busy learning about Holy Week in RE. They sequenced the week, learnt the special names for the days, and what happened on each day. In geography, the children learnt a song about the seven continents of the world and labelled a map. They learnt which continents the different countries they have been looking at each week are found in.

Pendower Class have finished their music unit of learning about call and response African songs. The children performed their piece of music to the school in assembly. They were fantastic! In PSHE, they have been looking at what they can do to keep their bodies healthy. We spoke about the different food groups and then made a healthy snack to try.

Porthcurnick Class have written some excellent biographies of Nelson Mandela this week. In music, we learned about swing rhythms and had a go at making up some of their own. In art, using Stone Age cave wall paintings as inspiration, we experimented with negative and positive images using our hands and paint.

It's been a busy week back in Portholland Class. We have been designing our own cuddly Easter eggs, to make next week, as well as designing and describing our very own Mars Rover. We have also had very sensible conversations about food and having a positive body image in PSHE.

Porthluney Class have been reading *Boy in the Tower* by Polly Ho-Yen this week, a book they have been using to inspire their writing. The children have enjoyed learning about what it might be like to live in a tower block in central London. A dystopian novel, the book explores what would happen if a



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strange plant species (the bluchers) began to appear, destroying buildings while people are sleeping inside of them.

Active Cornwall have launched the Easter Time2Move Holiday Programme which aims to support families during the school holidays to ensure children have access to fun activities, healthy food and physical activity and to address those particular challenges for some families because of increased costs such as food, childcare and reduced income.

It brings together providers across Cornwall who put on a wide range of diverse activities that are fully funded for those eligible for benefits related, free school meals but available to all children aged 5 to 16.

Easter activities will run from April 3rd to the 7th and the 10th to the 14th and all children that attend will receive a healthy meal.

The Time2Move Holiday Programme for Easter 2023 is live. The programme offers fun physical activities, games and wider activities plus a funded meal for every child. All children are welcome to attend, and it is completely funded for children that are eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals. As a parent or guardian of a child eligible for benefits related, free school meals you will need your child's unique code in order to access the activities for free.
