Little Carne have shared the traditional tale of The Three little Pigs. We made our own houses of straw, sticks and bricks. On Tuesday, we went on a wellie walk around the village looking at the houses and what they were built with. We even had time to go to the park on our way back to school.

Towan Class have worked very hard on their phonics this week. I can see progression in their reading already. They have been learning about beat and tempo in music and especially loved hearing music with fast tempo. I am also very pleased to hear how well Towan Class can share and work together when they have been given a task.

Summers Class were very excited to be making the pizzas that they had been researching and planning for the last few weeks. They had drawn a plan for their pizza and followed that as closely as possible when making them. The children have also written their own versions of 'The Enormous Turnip' using different fruits and vegetables for their stories. There has been 'The Enormous Pumpkin', 'The Enormous Sweetcorn' and 'The Enormous Pear' amongst others. They have been great to read!

Porthcurnick had their first experience of chair drumming this week. We learned that our right foot is the bass drum, our left drumstick taps the chair seat for the snare drum and our right drumstick taps the top of the chair for the hi-hat. Thank you to Rowan who brought in enough bamboo cuttings to make the perfect drumsticks! In art, we looked to see what geometric shapes we could observe to help us sketch the outline of two macaws, then created tones of colours and also mixed colours to carefully paint them.

Portholland class have had another productive week. The children worked hard during their science lesson when they tested materials to see if they conducted electricity. Tasked with creating their own electric circuits that would enable materials to be tested, the children were challenged by this task but they enjoyed it greatly. The children discovered that some materials conduct electricity whereas others do not and, most interestingly, that some materials conduct it better than others.

Porthluney Class have been using charcoal to draw a scene that they had created - it was very messy, but a great way to demonstrate the techniques that they have learnt. The class have also been investigating the term 'semi-permeable' using sweets; they have then linked it to their science learning in order to explain how nutrients leave the digestive system (from the small intestine) and enter the circulatory system.

This week, Emily has been carrying out a census within year 5 and 6, to get their opinions on plans from Cuby council to improve the village.


We will be meeting on Monday 18th October to further discuss school improvement and fundraising ideas from our previous meeting.
