Dear Parents/Carers,

On Wednesday, I had the pleasure of accompanying Portholland Class on their school trip to Truro Farmers' Market, where they learned about the importance of shopping locally and ethically. Pupils represented the school in a confident and sensible manner, they asked insightful questions to deepen their knowledge and were wonderful representatives of our school.

Please can we politely remind all year 5/6 parent(s)/carer(s) that a deposit of £35.00 is due to be paid for the summer term, school residential. We will be celebrating Children in Need next Friday. Children can wear something spotty or stripy for a small donation which can be paid via Parentpay.

Yesterday, the children had a visit from two local Police Community Support Officers (see photos below). They led an assembly on road safety, with a particular focus on children riding their bikes and how to keep safe. The children learnt about all of the ways that they can keep safe on their bikes, such as wearing a helmet at all times, wearing bright, reflective clothing and checking that their bikes are safe to ride every time that they go out on them. They explained that this should include checking that brakes and lights are working correctly, that tyres are pumped up enough and have enough tread on them. The children listened well and responded with great questions and comments and our visitors were very impressed with the engagement of the children.

Little Carne Nursery have had a fantastic week learning all about Poppies for Remembrance. They painted them, made them out of playdough and learnt a song about them. They also made a Poppy wreath and we took the children down to the war memorial to lay it ourselves. They all walked so sensibly and had a great time!

Towan Class had a super week. They have been learning about autumn and how the trees change with each season. They have been looking at the importance of Remembrance Day and the children completed different tasks. In PSHE, they have been discussing how we are unique to others.



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This week, Summers Class has also been learning all about autumn. They have learnt about the weather and created a weather vane which they can use to measure the strength and direction of the wind. They have also been thinking about the different colours that are associated with autumn leaves and used these to create a piece of artwork using fruits and vegetable printing. Finally, they have been learning a traditional barn dance in PE with Mrs Whitford.

Porthcurnick Class this week started to learn to play badminton, initially using balloons. We also continued our chair drumming and we are sounding more like a rock band every lesson! In art, we used mark making and blending with watercolour pencils to draw orangutans.

Portholland Class enjoyed visiting Truro Farmers' Market on Wednesday. The children enjoyed finding out about locally grown produce and the products that are sold at the market. The children were a credit to you and to the school as they spoke politely to the stallholders.

This week, Porthluney Class have completed their art topic by creating models inspired by a single sentence. They have also learnt about food groups and a healthy diet, started to play badminton with shuttlecocks and practised a French song, which they will be recording soon.

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# Your School Nurse

Your child can have access to a School Nurse at any time if you have any health concerns, in addition your School Nurse offers a full health assessment in reception and year 6.

## The School Nurse can check:

- Your child is growing healthily and support with healthy eating
- Support with access to dental care and general support for dental hygiene
- Help with day / night time wetting or soiling
- Provide information about immunisations
- Guidance re healthy lifestyles
- Support with general hygiene issues including head lice and worms
- Support with general emotional health issues
- Support to access other health professionals
- Routines, including sleep

- Friendships
- Relationships
- Development, including periods and puberty
- Access to specialist services – including dietician, healthy weight programmes and voluntary services
- Developmental issues
- Transition to secondary school
- Healthy lifestyles
