Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a rather busy second week back! Some classes have started their beach trips and, despite the weather, have had great fun exploring their named class beaches; this has also been the launch of class artwork for the half-term. Year six pupils have participated in Bikeability and Emma Roberts was delighted with their behaviour and biking skills. The nursery has welcomed lots of new young pupils and all have settled incredibly well. It is so lovely to see pupils aged 2-11 years in our school, and the nurturing care from older pupils to our younger children.

Next Friday marks the 20th anniversary for Jeans for Genes Day, a national fundraiser/children's charity, which raises money for the care of children and families who are affected by genetic disorders. People across the UK make a small donation to wear their jeans to school. Money that is raised is then distributed through the Jeans for Genes Grant Programme for care services for children and information and support for families. We are inviting pupils to wear their jeans (with their usual school tee-shirt and jumper), for a small donation. The Gateway will be open on Monday morning.

Key Stage 1 parents were sent a letter regarding a phonics information meeting on Tuesday 27th September at 2pm or 6pm. This is a very important meeting about how we teach phonics at school and the importance of parental support with this at home. We have moved to a new phonics scheme and would like all of our parents to attend what is the most important aspect of a child's early learning at the start of their educational journey.

The beginning of the school year has brought with it lots of viruses and bugs, which cannot be helped. An attendance policy has been sent to all parents which can be viewed on our school website. Please can I remind you that, if your child arrives after the register is closed, which is at about 9.00am, it is an unauthorised absence. Please read the policy which is located on the website. Thank you.

Little Carne Nursery has welcomed even more children this week. They have completed successful settling sessions and joined our nursery with smiles on their faces. We have been very proud of them. We have begun our learning by exploring and identifying colours as well as investigating our key question 'Who are you?' The children have drawn self portraits using charcoal, discussed their favourite toys and celebrated differences between each other. Please can we ask that the consent forms and Early Years passports that were sent home in book bags are completed and returned by the end of next week. Please keep checking tapestry for important documents and observations of your child's learning journey.

Towan Class have been learning their first set one letters (m,a,s,d and t) and have been trying really hard to form their letters correctly. They have been exploring patterns and sorting objects within maths. The children have especially enjoyed exploring wax crayons by drawing and rubbing different objects and surfaces. We have also been reading 'Funny Bones' and exploring the different body parts.

Summer Class has been working hard this week. They have learnt about the artist Bridget Riley, and have created pieces of art, drawing different types of lines in white chalk on black card. They have also started learning about the Christian creation story, finding out what different things God created on the different days. They have also been continuing with learning about pulse and rhythm in music lessons, keeping the pulse to songs such as 'Happy' and clapping the rhythm of animal names.

Pendower Class have been working hard this week. They have learnt about what a parable is in RE. They listened to and retold the story of the lost son. Then we created a hidden meaning box where they drew pictures of the story on the outside and we wrote the meaning on the inside. In music, they started to look at pitch and play instruments to the beat of the song.

This week, Porthcurnick Class enjoyed exploring their very own beach and sketching different scenes. (see our blog on the school website) In history, they have also been learning about the Romans, looking at what an empire is and how far reaching the Roman Empire was. In French they learned how and when to say Bonjour, Bonsoir and Bonne Nuit.



Portholland Class have been working hard this week, learning and singing about expanded noun phrases ready to use in their writing. They have also been building and troubleshooting with their own electrical circuits and learning about baptism. To make up for all of this hard work, they enjoyed a day exploring Portholland beach and the footpaths around it - take a look at our blog for pictures.

Porthluney Class have been working hard this week, writing soliloquies as Percy Jackson in English. They have also learnt about Ancient Greek city states including Athens and Sparta. Year 6 have enjoyed their first Bikeability sessions of the year; all the children who took part showed great maturity and a sensible attitude to the sessions.

Don't forget that Monday is a Bank Holiday and school will be closed. We look forward to seeing you on Tuesday.

Childcare offers for parents

Over a million families in the UK are entitled to support with the costs of childcare from the government, but many don't realise that they're eligible. By utilising the different offers, parents and carers with children aged 0–16 could get financial support worth thousands of pounds. Along with the usual types of childcare (e.g. childminders and nurseries) the support packages can be used across many different types of providers, such as:Holiday activity clubs, School wraparound care, Extracurricular clubs such and sports, drama, and music tuition, Religious settings, i.e. Jewish yeshivas and chedarim, Muslim madrassahs and Christian Sunday schools.
