Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

Thank you to all the parent(s)/carer(s) for attending our parents' evening on Wednesday. If you did not manage to attend, your child's class teacher will contact you to make an appointment.

In assembly today, we talked as a school about how, as one of our 'Three Rs', we must all show responsibility by informing an adult if they see another pupil/s behave or act in a way that they know to be wrong. We discussed how the word 'snitch' should not be used as we all have a responsibility to care for ourselves and one another. This is an integral part of our school community. It can be hard for staff to challenge unacceptable behaviours if they are not seen or reported to an adult. We have available adults supervising at lunchtime and break times but we want to support our pupils in taking personal responsibility for their actions too. This is also very much part of our PSHE curriculum. Please can you encourage your children to report these things to us at school, when they arise. This will help us to tackle any problems swiftly and fairly. Thank you.

Little Carne Nursery have enjoyed a week learning about different celebrations. First, Halloween, then Diwali and finally Bonfire night. This linked very well into our investigation question 'Where does light come from?' The children enjoyed making Diya lamps, visiting the Bonfire at Tregony playing field and creating firework artwork. They have had a particularly tasty week as well with an Indian feast of different foods, celebration cake and edible sparklers. We have also welcomed two new members of staff. Liz will be working every Thursday and Kirsty will be joining us for Forest School Friday. They have enjoyed getting to know the children.

Towan Class had a lovely week exploring different festivals. The class listened to Hindu music, followed by dancing to different kinds of music. The children learnt about Diwali and what happens during the five days of celebration. At the end of the week, the children discussed bonfire night and why we celebrate it. They had the opportunity to make Rangoli patterns using sand, and firework pictures.

In Summers Class this week, the children have been learning about schools in the past. They learnt that in some classes there could have been up to 100 children and that boys and girls often had separate schools. They also found out about the different types of punishments that children in the past would have received, and are quite glad that they attend school now, rather than in the past!

Pendower Class have started their geography unit of learning about seasons this week. This week, we have been observing the weather and making predictions on what we think the weather will be like over the next few days. We have added our predictions to a class tally chart.

In Porthcurnick class we have started our new book 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' and have been getting to know the main character Lila. In geography, we have been learning about the structure of the Earth and why volcanoes and earthquakes happen. In art, we used our thumbnail sketches of parts of a flower to scale up to A3 size!

In Portholland Class we have started writing our adverts which are based upon stories from other cultures. In PSHE, we have also been exploring our understanding of respecting different cultures and how different cultures are created.

Porthluney Class have been enjoying an art project this week. After visiting the beach last term, the children were tasked with drawing beach items. Then the children carved out designs from lino which they then turned into prints.
