Friday 7th May

Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

We have had a very busy week! On Tuesday and Wednesday, we spent the day recruiting a new teacher to join our team in September. All candidates, and Mr Challis, commented on how welcoming and attentive our pupils were and how the school had a very positive, orderly and hard-working atmosphere. I must say, the behaviour of our Year 4 and 5 pupils was exceptional and, once again, made me feel so very proud. We will be informing you of our new addition to our team very soon. We also resumed our Friday sharing assembly this week. Reuniting as key stage bubbles really did feel quite special and another tentative step towards normality. Let us hope that very soon we will be reunited as a whole school. Today, I had the pleasure of watching Class Porthcurnick's final swimming session. The swimming teachers commented on the astounding progress they have made over the week and I can honestly say that there was not a reticent swimmer amongst them.

Towan Class has been exploring how to measure in different ways. They have been learning about Queen Victoria and her reign duringas queen. In English, the children loved drawing what their magic bean will turn into. In science, the children have been discussing and ng and exploring how to care for different pets. They have identified that all pets need different things.

Summers Class have been hunting for bugs this week. They have been learning about different types of habitats and microhabitats and, yesterday, they visited our woodland habitat and searched for different minibeasts. They found lots of woodlice and slugs, along with a few spiders and flies and one ladybird. After spotting the minibeasts, they created pictograms from their findings. The children worked together brilliantly in their groups, helping and supporting each other throughout the whole lesson.

Porthcurnick Class have had very busy afternoons this week, swimming every day. They have shown great spirit and stamina and we have all thoroughly enjoyed watching their progress. In class, they have been learning about the Earth's water cycle and how rivers shape the land and create the most amazing features through erosion. We also think we are finally mastering fractions!

The children in Portholland class have been diving deeper into their Viking topic. This week they have spent time learning about Scandinavia and the countries it is made up of as well as taking a closer look at the climate in the area. In art, the children completed individual small world Viking scenes and I was extremely pleased with the creativity that they showed.

Porthluney Class have been researching Maya masks as well as creating self-portraits in the style of an event mask. They have also started their geography topic, based on South America, as well as classifying animals and objects in science and programming games in computing. This afternoon, they enjoyed their second sailing session.


