What a busy week we have had! Our year 6 pupils were joined by pupils form Gerrans school for a day of learning about internet safety and anti-bullying with 'Stay Safe'. They all contributed some thoughtful and considered comments.

On Thursday evening and today, our Key stage 1 pupils enjoyed a UV disco, barbecue, twilight walk and sleepover in the school with breakfast cooked by our wonderful kitchen staff, Susie and Kasha. They all had a wonderful time but have been very sleepy today! We think parents will have a very peaceful evening ahead! Thank you too, to the staff who arrange and supervise these wonderful experiences for our pupils.

Today, Delilah, Ava, Ary ,Layla, Robert, Tyler, Sennen and Isaac competed in the Truro and Roseland Learning community sporting games and won first place and a medal in the 'Kids Squats' round.

The first two days of term will be INSET days (Monday 4th and Tuesday 5th September). Children will commence the new school year on Wednesday 6th September.

We are extremely proud of Little Carne Nursery this week. Not only did we have 22 children aged 2 - 4 years walking 10 laps of the sports field for our sponsored walk, we have had five children successfully potty train and sent our preschoolers for a wonderful transition session today into Towan. What great achievements for them all. We are pleased to announce the Nursery raised £370 for Barnardos. A big thankyou to you all.

This week, Towan Class have been learning all about the country France and have explored what significant foods they eat. They have also impressed me by working as a whole class to plant their own bean plants independently. This included; getting pots themselves, soil, seed and water.

This week, Summers Class have been learning about trees in science. They learnt about evergreen and deciduous trees and how to identify which is which by looking at their leaves. They also learnt the names of some different types of trees. In art this week, the children have created sculptures using sticks and wool, in the style of the artist Judith Scott.

This week, in science, Pendower Class have been looking at what plants need to stay healthy. We planted some seeds for an investigation; we can't wait to see them change as they grow! In DT, we have made a pouch by sewing two pieces of material together with a running stitch. Next week, we will be able to decorate them.

The highlight of the week in Porthcurnick Class has been designing and making slingshot cars. First, the children built a chassis. Then, they designed and created the body, thinking carefully in pairs about their design criteria. They all worked very sensibly with glue guns and junior hacksaws and made some very impressive cars. Finally, they launched them in the hall and afterwards had a debrief about what they liked and what they would improve next time.

This week, Portholland Class have been writing a setting description based on 'The Clocktower. They have been focussing on using different sentence openers and using conjunctions to extend their sentences. They have also been researching and labelling the parts of a surfboard, ready to design their own as part of their new design and technology topic.



Porthluney Class have started their new geography topic this week. This term, the children will be studying the geography of the River Fal. Using printed Ordnance Survey maps, the children identified the course of the river from source to mouth. On Thursday, our Y6 children participated in a Stay Safe workshop, which was a very informative and useful session.
