Little Carne Nursery has really enjoyed a space theme this week. They have made planets, rockets and enjoyed pretending to be spacemen in our dark den spaceship. The children have worked on independence this week and have made us very proud by selecting their resources they will need to carry out their ideas. Can I request that the children continue to wear closed in shoes, even when the weather is nice, as we have had some accidents this week relating to their open toes.

Towan Class have been busy thinking of questions they could ask an alien from space. They have enjoyed focusing on the book 'The Way Back Home'. The children have especially enjoyed experimenting with different musical instruments and linking it to a story. In continuous provision, the children have been making their own transport to the moon and writing lists of what they would take with them.

The year 2s in Summers Class have been very busy this week completing their SATs. They have worked extremely hard, tried their best and have shown a great attitude towards their learning. Also, this week, Summer Class have been learning about timbre in music and experimenting with instruments to find all of the different sounds one instrument can make. They then used these sounds to create the noises that different animals make.
