In Towan class this week, we have been exploring different buildings within London. The children have remembered lots of facts! In maths, we have been looking at 3D shapes and capacity. In science, the children have especially enjoyed learning about different materials and how to make an umbrella.



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In Summers Class this week we have been finishing our English work by writing fact files about the moon. The children have found out some very interesting facts about the moon such as it was created about 4.5 billion years ago and there have been 12 people who have walked on the moon. They have really enjoyed learning about the moon during their space topic.

This week in Porthcurnick, we have been writing non-chronological reports about the Roman army, learning about the revolt led by Boudicca and working on our soundscape for the eruption of Vesuvius which we will perform to Mrs Douglass next week.

In Portholland class this week we have been busy writing our final stories based on the The Dreadful Menace poem. Mr Marriott has been impressed in the progress we have made with our tennis skills and we have really enjoyed learning the rules and beginning to play games.
