Dear Parents/Carers,

This week, Little Carne has been learning all about pets and vets. They enjoyed painting their own portraits of their pets and showing photos of their pets to all of their friends during a show and tell session. They also had a great time meeting baby lambs in our outdoor area. It was very exciting!

This week, Towan Class had the pleasure of meeting baby lambs and learning about different farm animals. They have especially enjoyed learning about forces such as push and pull. The children have also amazed me with their super art work and have painted backgrounds for silhouettes using water colours.

This week, Summers Class have been trying to solve the problem of their missing superhero. Clues have been left during the week and they have now decided that the culprit is red and has eight legs, but they are yet to solve what he/she/it is called! Hopefully, next week, they will be able to solve the mystery and recover their superhero. Also this week, they have been learning about natural and man-made materials and were very surprised to discover that silk is a natural material, made by silkworms.

Porthcurnick Class have written some excellent news reports about a dragon visit to our school. In art, the children practised mark making then used carbon paper and tracing paper to create a print of a baby dragon curled up in an egg. In P.E, they are beginning to create dragon dances, thinking carefully about their movements to tell as story.

This week, Portholland started their new history topic, which is based on journeys. The children will be learning about historically significant journeys. This week, the children learnt about the importance of the trans-Atlantic journeys made by Sir Walter Raleigh during the Tudor and Stuart periods. The children investigated whether Sir Walter was just in it for the money.

Porthluney started their science topic, which is based on light, by completing challenges to demonstrate their understanding. Lots of children have also been researching their family and the role that they played in World War Two - we've enjoyed examining artefacts and photos and hearing their stories.

On Monday, pupils were entertained to a drumming demonstration by Sam Pert, a drumming tutor from Cornwall Music Service Trust. Many children have expressed an interest and it is nearly full.

COVID UPDATES:

Reminder on the temporary suspension of confirmatory PCR tests in education and childcare settings

On Tuesday, the DfE updated us on the temporary pause of confirmatory PCR tests. As a reminder, you are only asked to take a follow up PCR test after a positive LFD test if you:

- wish to claim the Test and Trace Support Payment
- have been advised to take a PCR test because you are in a clinically vulnerable group
- have been advised to do so as part of a research or surveillance programme
- have received a positive day 2 LFD after arriving into the UK
- The temporary suspension of a confirmatory PCR test is for individuals who are asymptomatic. Individuals who are experiencing any of the main symptoms of COVID-19 (a new continuous cough, high temperature/fever and loss or change to smell/taste) should take a PCR test. However, if an individual is experiencing symptoms and has already had a positive LFD test result, they do not need to take a PCR test as well and should isolate.

From Monday 17th January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be <u>reported to NHS Test and Trace</u>.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, you should continue to self-isolate until you get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.

Health and Safety:

Please can we politely request that children do not use/play on the school equipment during pick up and after school. Thank you.

Medical Appointments:

Going forward, please can all parents/carers complete a Notice of Appointment form to make the school aware of any upcoming medical or dental appointments for your child. You will need to attach an appointment card/letter or screen shot to the completed form. This form is available to download from the school website under the attendance tab, or you may collect a copy from the school office. Thank you.
