Dear Parent(s)/carer(s),

What a busy week! After weeks of hard work, our Key Stage Two pupils performed amazingly in our production 'The Rocky Monster Show'. The show was a sell out and audiences were impressed with the professionalism and talent of our pupils. Please see our Facebook page for photos.

Next week is busy too! Our Year 5/6 pupils are on school camp from Monday to Wednesday and our Year 6 leavers have a celebration evening on Thursday. We are also inviting our parents to attend our final assembly of the school year at 9.15am. Families of our nursery leavers will be holding a celebration ceremony at 12.45pm..

We are holding a raffle to win a £100 brewery voucher and a bottle of the new Tarquins gin. This will be drawn on Tuesday. Tickets can be purchased on the school gateway for £1.00. Good luck!

As from September, we are offering wrap-around-care for our nursery, pre-school pupils (children who will be starting school in September 2023). A breakfast Club session starts at 7.45 am at a cost of



£5.00. Our after school club session costs £7.00 and ends at 5.30pm. Places are limited due to staffing constraints and will be offered on a first-come-first-served basis. Places are booked half-term in advance via the school office and will be open for bookings on <u>Monday morning</u>. Bookings should be made by Tuesday 19th July (dkirby@tregony.comwall.sch.uk). The Multi-Academy Trust will invoice for payment in advance and any missed sessions will be charged.

<u>Don't forget that the school closes at 1.30pm on Friday 22nd July, with no wrap-around-care.</u> Please can we ask that, as a matter of urgency, all outstanding dinner money is paid by Monday 18th July at the latest. Please can all library books be returned this week. Thank you.

Next week, we are anticipating extreme weather conditions. As a school, we will be keeping rooms well ventilated and encouraging children to seek shade and stay hydrated. Please ensure that your child brings a water bottle to school. Encourage your child to wear light clothing and sun hats with wide brims, Sunscreen, should be applied at home before the start of the day.

I am disappointed to hear that some older siblings of our pupils, who are picking their younger brothers and sisters up from school, are using inappropriate language on the playground at the end of the school day. The Roseland Academy is aware of this and we are not accepting of this behaviour. Should this continue, we will not permit them on the school premises as this sets a bad example to children and a poor representation of their school and Trust.

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Little Carne Nursery has been enjoying exploring changes this week. They have observed ice melting to water, colour changing with powder paints and making bubbles. Our preschoolers have also been busy preparing their preschool leavers ceremony. It is sure to be a fabulous event.

Towan Class have impressed me this week with their super behaviour. They have really enjoyed looking at and exploring different castles. The children spent a long time this week making, drawing and painting their own castles. They have had a lovely week outside in the sunshine developing their skills during their independent learning.

This week, Summers Class have been learning more about meerkats. After reading the story 'Meerkat Mail', they wanted to find out more about them. They thought of questions they would like to find answers to and used the I-pads to complete their research into meerkats. Also, this week, they have been learning an African call and response song in music and they enjoyed watching the KS2 production.

This week, Porthcurnick Class have been learning about different bones in their bodies and then carefully following instructions to create skeletons that move. Year 3 had an active maths lesson based on capacity, measuring how much water different containers held and then comparing them to others, whilst Year 4 have been learning about symmetry.

Portholland Class have been busy with a DT project this week. First, the children tasted and evaluated a range of bolognese sauces. In a blind taste test, they quickly identified the most expensive sauce but they did not think it was the tastiest; in fact, many thought the cheapest one tasted the best. After tasting sauces, the children enjoyed making their own.

Porthluney Class have concluded their geography for this term by learning about the human geography of and tourism in the Caribbean. They have also been practising their Oscars performance, ready for next Thursday.

Please may we remind you that our first day back after the Summer Term is on Tuesday 6th September. Attending school on the first day of the school year is very important as pupils have had a long break, have new teachers, different classes and peers. It is very important for a positive and



settled start to the school year for your child and as a Trust, we are aiming for 100% attendance. From September, we will be asking parent(s)/carer(s) to inform the school of any pupil absence by 9.00am.
