Little Carne Nursery has enjoyed reading Handa's Surprise this week. They explored the fruit and retold the story using animal masks. They also really enjoyed matching up pairs of socks on our washing line this week too. Please can we remind all parents to ensure jumpers and drinks bottles have names clearly labelled as they are getting mixed up. Also we are running low on Nursery pants and socks. If you have any at home, please bring them in for our children to use as spares. .

This week, Towan Class have shown super listening skills during class inputs. The children enjoyed comparing themselves to others in the class. They have also been learning about Rosa Parks. In maths, the children have been exploring and making patterns using a range of different resources. On Wednesday, the children had the opportunity to go up to The Roseland farm to help dig up their freshly grown potatoes and clean the rabbit cages.



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In Summers Class this week, we have been continuing to learn about our senses. This week, we have been using our sense of smell to identify different ingredients hidden in pots. Also this week, we have been exploring life in the past through the 'Great Grandma's Attic' treasure box, borrowed from The Royal Cornwall Museum. The children have been able to experience objects from lives in the past, such as an old camera, generations of telephones and mobile phones and a coronation mug and newspaper.

In Pendower Class this week, we have been learning how to draw characters. We looked at illustrations from the artist Quentin Blake in a selection of Roald Dahl books. We sketched our own characters and added detail to them by adding facial expressions. In music, we have been looking at musical notation on a glockenspiel. We created our own melodies, wrote down the notes so other people could play them and then we played our own to the class.

In Porthcurnick Class this week, we watched the film 'The Present' about a disabled boy who is given a disabled puppy as a present, and then wrote our own dialogue for the beginning of the film. In art, we learned how to draw like botanical artists and produced some wonderful sketches of different plants. In music, we learned to play different motifs on the glocks as part of our Roman song warmup.

This week, Portholland Class have been writing excellent persuasive letters including modal verbs and expanded noun phrases, and redrafting them into their Star Writer books. In science, the children have been investigating switches and using their knowledge to design their own - have a look at our blog for pictures of this. In PE, they have completed a fitness circuit and assessed their performance against last week - next week, they will be designing their own.

This week, Porthluney Class have participated in Mini Police workshops led by two local police officers, Toby and Phil. The children tried on several items of police uniform (please look at our blog for photos) and found out about the work of police officers. The children learnt about anti-social behaviour in our local area and discussed how to stay safe online. We are now going to consider how to take what we have learnt into our local community.

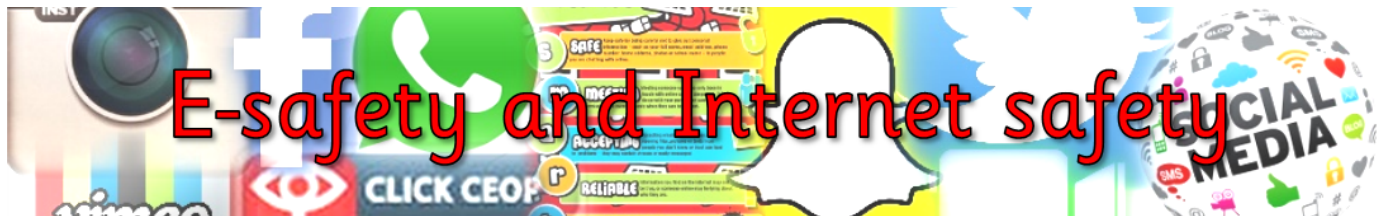
