Portholland Class enjoyed a wonderful art afternoon. The children have been exploring Penelope with the Suitors by the Italian painter Pintoricchio. Inspired by both his work and the work of Henri Matisse, the children created their own vibrant collages of the images in the painting. We have all been incredibly impressed by their artwork.
