Miss Uren, our Year 2 teacher, led a Reading fluency meeting with parents and pupils this week. Fluent reading supports reading comprehension. When pupils read fluently, their cognitive resources can be redirected from focusing on decoding and onto comprehending the text and this is a very important aspect of our reading curriculum so thank you to those who attended.

We will be holding a KS2 SATs meeting for all parents of Y6 children in the school hall on Monday 13th March at 6:00pm. We are looking forward to seeing you at this very important meeting.

Little Carne Nursery have enjoyed their first week back. We have been very proud of how quickly they settled back after half term. This week, the children enjoyed making pancakes and playing games on the playing field. The children have also enjoyed creating obstacle courses as we practise balancing as a key skill.

This week, Towan Class have been learning all about different types of families and their different roles. They have been moving to music linked to a familiar song 'Teddy bears picnic'. The children have also continued to look at the past and present. This week, focusing on transport. The class essentially enjoyed learning all about Shrove Tuesday and why we have pancake day.

This week, Summers Class have been writing list poems about what they can see if they look up. This was based around the story 'Look Up'. The children thought about what they can see in the sky during the day and night and then thought of words to describe these. They all produced some fantastic poems. Also this week, in science the children have started learning about the different seasons and the different types of weather you may see in each season.

This week, Pendower Class have started internalising their new information text Giants. In science, the children were investigating how materials can change. The children spent time squashing, bending, twisting and stretching different materials.

This week, Porthcurnick Class started their new English book 'Journey to Jo'burg,' set in the time of Apartheid in South Africa. In geography, they found out where the Alps are and the eight countries the mountains run through. They were also set a challenge to design a safety lamp for miners which they will be making next week.

This week, Portholland class have been orally learning and retelling the story of Beowulf. In science, we have been learning about the moon and the different parts of the moon cycle, before recreating each part with jaffa cakes.

This week, Porthluney Class have been using a range of resources to create their own piece of artwork that enables them to make their voice heard. Inspired by artists who use art to convey a message, the children have created pieces of artwork that contain a message that is important to them while revealing a little about themselves, their interests and what they consider to be important in our world today.

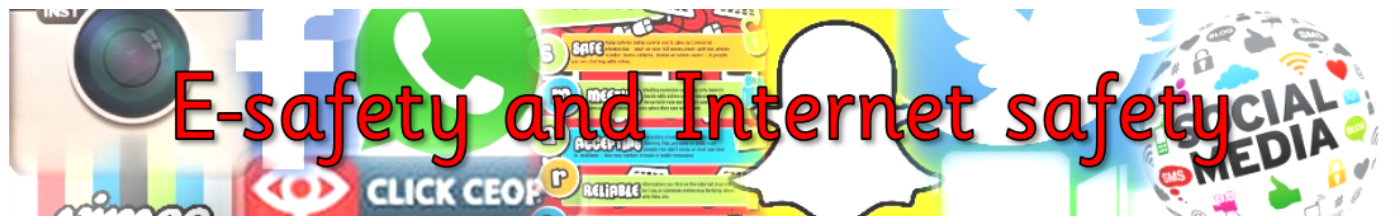
