Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

Yesterday, our pupils enjoyed performing songs and poetry to their families in our Harvest Festival. On Thursday, we were visited by seven of our colleagues from across The Trust, Mr Challis our CEO, local governors and staff from other primary schools including primary heads. Little Carne Nursery have enjoyed listening and retelling the story of The Little Red Hen and exploring harvest food within their play. They have also been busy learning to recognise and spot patterns. As the weather is getting wetter outside, we are seeing a lot of children coming into Nursery wearing Wellie Boots. Please can we ask that they always have a pair of shoes with them to change into inside Nursery, as it is not practical for inside play and government guidelines advise that it is not good for their feet due to lack of support of the ankles. We are happy to assist the children to change into their shoes once at Nursery.

This week, Towan Class have been learning about different houses in Tregony and comparing them with others from around the world. In maths, they have started to learn about subitising and creating pictorial numbers. Our text of the week is Room on the Broom. The children have been freeze-framing and learning parts of the story. We were very proud of the class yesterday when they performed for the first time in front of an audience.

This week, Summers Class have been learning about the senses of hearing and taste. They enjoyed tasting different fruits and describing what they tasted like, and played a listening game, identifying



sounds they might hear around the home. Also this week, they have learnt about different toys from the past and have learnt and written about the festival of Harvest.

This week, Pendower Class finished their history unit, learning about the Great Fire of London. They looked at the consequences of the fire and decided if the fire had made London a better or a worse place. Most of them decided the fire helped London become a better place to live. They have also been writing a set of instructions after receiving a letter from the wolf from our English text 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes'. He asked the children to write a set of instructions to help him make some delicious pancakes because he has lost his cookbook!

In Portholland class pupils had a great time in Forest School. They learnt why the leaves on trees turn colour and why they shed in winter and used this experience to produce artwork which natural items which are then returned to the environment.

Porthcurnick Class have created their own musical motifs and used graphic notation to write them down. In art, they made viewfinders and used these to 'zoom in' on different parts of a photograph of a flower, then used their skills of observation and mark making to make thumbnail sketches. In computing, they have finished and then presented their Google Slides presentations about rocks and Pompeii to the class.

Porthluney Class has been finishing this term's art topic this week; the children have been learning about photography as an art form. In one lesson, the children created photomontages; the children demonstrated amazing creativity and imagination in their work. In another lesson, the children explored the stylised photography of Derrick Boateng. In their final lesson, the children explored the photographic portraits of Chuck Close and they enjoyed making their own artwork in this artist's style.



The School Council has supported us with deciding the cultures of our school. We have decided on Tregony's 'Three Rs' - *Respectful, Responsible and Resilient.*
