We have had another busy week, with a visit from a Read Write Inc specialist who is supporting our delivery of phonics. This was a highly positive visit and she was very impressed by the impact this is already having on reading in our school. Pupils wore something spotty in aid of Children in Need and we have raised £74.00 so far. Thank you for your kind donations, The Gateway will remain open until Monday. Little Carne Nursery has been busy this week exploring battery lights. They have enjoyed sitting in the dark den with different coloured lights as well as searching for objects with torches. They created a space station and pretended to be astronauts and acted out our core text 'Whatever next' using props to help them.

Towan Class have been incredibly busy this week. We have been reading the book 'The Squirrels who Squabbled.' The class enjoyed learning all about the words 'squealed' and 'squabbled' and many other new words. On Monday, the children enjoyed painting with their fingers, trying to only use one colour per finger.

This week, Summers Class have been learning about places that are nearby and faraway and talked about some of the furthest places they have visited. They have also been learning more about animals, in science this week, by looking at the similarities and differences between birds and reptiles.

Pendower Class have been learning about wind and its direction and how this affects temperature. We made our own windsocks so we could monitor the wind direction. In English we have been describing settings using expanded noun phrases.

Porthcurnick Class have been writing descriptions of the Ceremony of the Full Moon in the Fireworkmaker's Daughter. They have also learned about why earthquakes happen and how we measure their strength.

Portholland class have been discussing other cultures and enjoyed creating ribbons against racism. In Geography, we have managed to make it rain when understanding the part that rivers play in the water cycle. We are also planning myths and it would be fabulous if the children could rehearse these at home.

Porthluney Class have been busy exploring the original fairy tales written by the Grimm brothers this week. Far from the Disney fairy tales we are used to, these stories are much grittier; the children were very engaged!. We are now going to be exploring several more fairy tales before planning and writing our own.
