Dear Parent(s)/carer(s),

It has been another busy week across the school! Pupils experienced a day with their new classes, teachers and peers. We welcomed four new pupils in Key Stage 2, not including our 22 reception pupils. Our very youngest pupils (some still only aged three) were incredible - with no tears at all! It was lovely to see that our Year 6 pupils had a marvellous day at the Roseland Academy, demonstrating their readiness for the next stage of their education. Our onsite nursery held an open day with many prospective pupils interested in starting in September. This day highlighted our seamless transitions from Tregony Primary to The Roseland Academy from ages 2-16 years old.

We had two police officers visit us on Monday afternoon to talk to pupils about road safety and keeping themselves safe at the end of the school day. Some of our Year 3/4 pupils experienced a day of surfing at Fistral Beach and the surf school commented on the excellent behaviour of our pupils.

Rehearsals for the Key Stage 2 Summer performance are well underway; don't forget that all Key Stage 2 pupils are taking part in this. Tickets will be on sale next week. We are hoping to hold a raffle; any



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donations of prizes would be gratefully received. Please can we request that all dinner money, wrap-around care and nursery fees are paid in full.

Little Carne Nursery has enjoyed a week of learning about Shapes. They created pictures using shapes including smiley faces, houses, rockets and flowers. They were able to draw and identify the shapes and select the correct ones for their pictures. We have been very impressed with their sports day practice. They are getting very good at running in a straight line.. Our Preschool children enjoyed their first full day in Towan class and are getting very excited to move on in September.

Towan Class has been learning about odd and even numbers. They have also been discussing what they would pack in their travel bag if they went on an adventure, linking to our book of the week 'The Great Explorer'. The children really enjoyed music this week where they had to copy beats using different musical instruments.

This week, Summers Class have been busy comparing different animals. They have been looking at the different animal types, but also how animals vary within their own groups. They have talked about how most birds fly, but some cannot and how some mammals walk on two legs and some on four. In RE, they have been learning the story of Noah's Ark and the importance of caring for our planet.

Porthcurnick Class this week have been working on their shading technique in art. In science, they have been learning about vertebrates and invertebrates, understanding what they are and then sorting different animals into these categories.

In science this week, Portholland Class have investigated the gestation period of different animals. Here are some fascinating facts that they discovered:

- The blue whale has a gestation period of around 11 months.
- The African elephant has the longest known gestation period of any animal, lasting a staggering 22 months.
- Some animals have gestation periods of only a few days. For example, the gestation period of a mouse can be as short as 19 days.

Porthluney Class have been learning about Rorschach and creating their own pictures from ink, as well as learning about adaptations and how they can both have positive and negative effects on living things. They have also been using the animation 'Replay' to practise writing in the first person.
