Welcome back to the Summer Term. I hope that you all enjoyed the dry weather we were blessed with during Easter. During the Easter holidays, Miss Robertson had a beautiful day for her wedding and is now known as Mrs Gunningham. We all wish her much happiness for the future.

I do apologise for the length of this letter but please take them time to read it. This term promises to be action packed with some pupils sitting their SATs, phonics checks, school residentials, trips, the school show and lots of sporting activities - not to mention the continuation of all other aspects of learning! There are many new dates added to the newsletter below so please take the time to read them.

It is also at this time of year that we start to consider class structures for next year. As you are aware, the school has mixed year groups and, due to this, some year groups are split. We will send a letter home regarding which class pupils will be placed in later this term in preparation for our transition day. With this in mind, we are very excited that due to our growing numbers; in September, we will



have an additional class in Key Stage 1, meaning that there will be single year groups for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. We will be recruiting for a new teacher this half term.

Little Carne Nursery has had a great first week back. We have welcomed new faces and they have settled fantastically, making friends and learning the routines of the Nursery. Can we remind all parents that, as the weather gets nicer and the temperature is hotter, please can children come to nursery with a sunhat and wearing suncream. We also want to remind you that we do not allow jewellery at Nursery. This includes beaded necklaces and bracelets. If children have made jewellery that they would like to show us, please can this be handed to Emily at the door and we will do a show and tell. It is becoming a health and safety risk in our setting. We have been talking a lot about spring this week and the children have been spotting signs of this season in our outside area as well as on our Welly Walk. We have also been learning about shapes. We have been very impressed how well our children can identify and name 2D shapes. Well done everyone.

Towan Class has had a very busy week. The children have set their pet butterflies free. They have especially enjoyed the start of their new topic 'Travel and Transport'. This week, they have been learning about past and present modes of transport alongside their book of the week 'You Can't Fit an Elephant on a Bus.' where they had to invent their own transport for an animal.

Summers Class were amazed to see animal footprints all over their classroom when they arrived at school on Monday. After some discussion and research, they were able to identify all but one of the footprints. During the week, they thought about what the mysterious animal could be and eventually they received a letter from the Natural History Museum explaining that it was a dodo, and the reason they couldn't identify it was because it had been extinct for more than 300 years. The children enjoyed learning about the dodo, what it looked like and why it became extinct and wrote fact files about them.

In Porthcurnick Class, we started our new topic 'Where Does Our Food Go?" by enacting a digestion drama in the playground! In music, we started learning about staff notation, we also listened to and discussed 'Night on a Bare Mountain' by Mussorgsky.

Portholland Class have made a great start to the Summer Term. The children have started their new topic, 'The Amazing Americas,' by identifying countries in both North and South America. The children have also looked at photographs of human and physical geographical features on both continents.

Porthluney Class have made an excellent start to their Summer Term and new topics. They have been exploring the planet 'Pandora' from 'Avatar' in English and are creating their own hexapods to write about. They have also been excited to start the drama rehearsals, which are sounding excellent!
